Olanyek, an Austrian, 28 years old, shot through a window of a cafe from the sidewalk after he had ordered a drink inside. It happened that Mayor Johnson and a companion were entering the cafe at the moment, but the mayor was not in danger. Olanyek was arrested.

EXPRESSES SORROW AT DEATH OF ITO

Washington, Oct. 29.—The following is the text of a message sent by President Taft to the emperor of Japan, expressing his sorrow at the death of Prince Ito: "I extend to your majesty and to the Japanese people my profound sympathy in the great loss sustained by you in the death of Prince Ito. I enjoyed the honor of his friendship, and I cannot too strongly condemn the wickedness of his murderers."

PRISONERS REMOVED TO SAFER LOCATION

Kansas City, Oct. 29.—To prevent possible lynching by a vigilance committee, reported to be forming among the farmers of Wyandotte county, Kas., in which the murders were committed, Sheriff Becker late last night removed James McMahon, the self-confessed murderer of his two sisters and brother-in-law, from the Kansas City, Kas., county jail to the city jail on the Missouri side.

MAKES GOOD FLIGHT.

Potsdam, Oct. 29.—Captain Engel Hardy, a pupil of Orville Wright, today made a flight lasting 44 minutes and 30 seconds. This is the longest flight, unaccompanied, that has been made by a German aviator.

MR. CROKER DECLINES TO TALK POLITICS

New York, Oct. 29.—For the first time since his retirement from the Tammany leadership several years ago Richard Croker is in New York city during the heat of a mayoralty campaign. Mr. Croker is here from Europe, he insists, solely for the purpose of visiting socially with his old friends and spending the winter in the south.
