

RORY McLEOD SELLS MARKET MOVEMENTS OF THE DAY BIG RANCH

AMBITION OF THE LATE MARCUS DALY IS REALIZED IN PURCHASE OF LANDS.

Hamilton, Nov. 3.—One of the most important instruments to be filed in the office of the county clerk and recorder of Ravalli county for some time was the deed for the transfer of the Rory McLeod ranch of 320 acres to the Bitter Root stock farm yesterday. The instrument states the consideration to be \$1, but it is learned upon good authority that the price was in the neighborhood of \$75,000. The transfer includes all of the stock and farm implements.

This deal is of importance to the reading public for several reasons. During the lifetime of Marcus Daly it was his ambition to secure this piece of land in order that the vast domain which he controlled should be a solid tract. In the tract which was owned by Mr. Daly, which was about 12 miles in length and over four miles in width, this was the only piece of land that he was unable to purchase. On several occasions Mr. Daly attempted to purchase it from Mr. McLeod, but they were invariably unable to agree upon the price.

It is learned that Mr. McLeod will give possession of the ranch on November 12. Upon removing from the ranch he will occupy one of his town properties. He will continue to make the Bitter Root valley his home and will take things easy the rest of his life. He has been exceptionally successful during his residence in the valley and is considered one of the most substantial citizens of Hamilton. He has acquired considerable property in this city, which he will retain, and will no doubt add to these holdings from time to time, as he considers this part of the country the best in which to make investments.

HIGGINS IS WANTED BY OFFICERS

MAN ALLEGED TO HAVE ROBBED COMPANION WHILE BOTH SLEPT TOGETHER.

Hamilton, Nov. 3.—It was reported to the sheriff's office here today by Sid Parks that he had been robbed last night of \$280 while in bed at his home, on the west side of the river, with a friend, Barney Higgins, who has since disappeared, and the officers are now engaged in a search for the missing man. Parks and Higgins had been drinking in town last evening and were considerably under the influence of liquor when they reached the home of the former. They retired together, and later, upon awakening, Parks discovered the disappearance of money and whiskey friend. At 3 o'clock he telephoned the story of his loss to the officers, who have since been looking for Higgins. One officer went to Missoula, while another has gone to Darby.

Grain and Provisions. Chicago, Nov. 3.—Heavy profit-taking in December wheat was the feature of the trading in the wheat market today. From \$1.04 1/2 touched early in the day, December sold off to \$1.01 1/2, which point was reached just before the close.

News regarding the cash situation in the northwest was the chief reason for the general unloading of large long lines. The corn market was of relative tone all day. At the close prices were only 1/4 to 3/8 below the final figures of the day previous.

At the close rates were 1/8 to 1/4 lower than yesterday. Provisions were firm all day. Prices at the close were 7 1/2 to 7 1/2 higher.

ATTORNEY GENERAL GIVES AN OPINION

Special to The Daily Missoulian. Helena, Mont., Nov. 3.—Attorney General Galen today gave to the board of land commissioners an opinion on the law governing the sale of timber lands. He holds that under the law the board can only sell lands with timber on them when the lands would be good for agriculture after the removal of the timber. In all other cases only the timber can be sold, the lands to be held by the state for re-forestation. This opinion is based on laws passed at the last session of the legislature, known as the conservation measures.
