CHEVROLET CAPTURES BIG EVENT

SEVERAL RECORDS FALL AT INAUGURAL MEET OF NEW ATLANTA SPEEDWAY.

Atlanta, Ga., Nov. 9.—Louis Chevrolet, the sturdy Swiss pilot of Buick cars, who has leaped into racing prominence within the last year, annexed another hard-earned victory here today when he captured the 200-mile stock chassis race, averaging about 72 miles an hour.

CHAMPION WRESTLER RETAINS TITLE

FRANK GOTCH WINS IN STRAIGHT FALLS FROM LATEST FOREIGN CHALLENGER.

Chicago, Nov. 9.—Frank Gotch, champion wrestler of the world, defeated Giovanni Raicevich of Italy in two straight falls at the Coliseum here tonight. The first fall was in 16 minutes 28 seconds, and the second in 5 minutes 28 seconds.

Before the championship match a telegram from Yousiff Mahmoud, whom Gotch defeated last year, challenging the winner of the match, was read from the ringside.

BASEBALL MAGNATES GET BUSY

NINETEEN LEAGUES REPRESENTED AT BIG MEETING—SEVERAL TRADES MADE.

Memphis, Tenn., Nov. 9.—The National Association of Minor Leagues held the opening session of its annual meeting here today, but transacted only routine business.

Nineteen leagues were represented. All the leagues in class A and class B were represented with the exception of the Eastern league, a member of the former class. The fact that one of the largest of the minor leagues was without a representative caused much comment among members.

Traders and Buyers Active. Several trades and sales were made today and more are said to be pending. The draft of Pitcher Allen of the Seattle Northwestern league club by Memphis has been allowed.

Outlaws Keep Players. Under the terms of the agreement drawn by Secretary J. Farrell of the National Association and President Frank Horman of the California State League, the Californians will be permitted to keep all players now with them who have violated their reserve clauses or contracts.

The report of Secretary J. H. Farrell of the National association, which was read at today's session, showed that the minor league organization is making rapid and appreciable gains. Thirty-seven leagues are now members of the National association and 257 cities are represented.

According to Mr. Farrell's report, the total amount received and paid out through his office for drafted players was \$159,850, as follows: National league, \$48,000; American league, \$52,500; National association, \$59,200. The grand total received in his office for drafted players, optional agreement players and released by purchase players was \$328,650.

MARKET MOVEMENTS OF THE DAY

New York, Nov. 9.—Dealings in stocks diminished today to the accompaniment of a somewhat higher rate for call loans in the money market. It is evident that the financial powers are agreed that conditions are not propitious for pushing speculative operations in securities.

More attention was given today to the money market developments than to the stock market. The further rise in the sterling exchange at Paris pointed to a movement of capital from Paris to London, which was helping to relieve the situation at the latter point.

Yesterday's reports of large buying of copper for export had lost their effect on the copper industrial and the general market lacked that sustaining influence.
