

EXTENT OF DAMAGE NOT DETERMINED

JAMAICA IS TRYING TO ASCERTAIN HOW BADLY SHE IS HURT BY STORM.

Kingston, Jamaica, Nov. 14.—After torrential rains lasting many days, normal weather conditions prevail, but it is difficult to ascertain the extent of the damage done by one of the worst storms in Jamaica history. Practically all telegraph lines are down and railroads have been badly washed out. While the entire eastern portion of the island was swept by winds and rains, no earth shocks occurred, and damage to crops and property resulted largely from floods. Reports from St. Mary, an important banana center, state that within a radius of 10 miles of Port Maria banana fields were entirely laid waste. The town of Annetto Bay for a time was three feet under water. Grave fears were entertained for several days regarding the safety of inhabitants of that section, but the floods are now subsiding. So far as can be learned no lives were lost.

The cables to Colon and Bermuda are still out of commission and attempts made by the coast station Arna to carry cable dispatches to Rotterdam bay on Wednesday night failed, heavy gales compelling the vessel to return. The Arna started yesterday on another attempt. It is not known here whether the cable to Santiago is intact.

Kingston did not suffer to any great extent from the hurricane, which developed 100 miles to the westward, and which had lost much of its fury by the time it reached here. The northern side of the island suffered severely and engineers estimate that it will be 10 days before railroad communication is re-established. Sources of the Kingston water supply are cut off and military authorities are assisting the local engineering staff in the construction of temporary conduits.

WELL-KNOWN SPORT IS DEAD

DAN A. STUART, PROMOTER OF THE CORBETT-FITZSIMMONS FIGHT, CASHES IN.

New York, Nov. 14.—Dan A. Stuart, one of the best-known sporting men in the country, died at his home here today of Bright's disease and heart disease. Born 52 years ago in Vermont, he made his name in the west. While in Dallas, Texas, he sought to secure permission for the Corbett-Fitzsimmons fight, and carried his arrangements so far that Governor Cullerton called a special session of the legislature to prohibit prize-fighting in the state. Later Stuart secured permission from the Nevada legislature to hold fights in that state, and as a result of his efforts the battle was finally brought about in Carson City on March 17, 1897.

To Kill Racing.
Hot Springs, Ark., Nov. 14.—It is said that the death of Dan Stuart will prove a death blow to racing here. He and "Blind John" Condon of Chicago owned the Oaklawn racetrack and he has been the principal backer of the effort to repeal the anti-racing law in this state.

STEAMER IS SAFE.
Duluth, Minn., Nov. 14.—The steamer James J. Hoyt, which is stranded on a reef two miles northeast of Otter Island, one of the Apostle group, is in comparative safety, according to the officers of the steamer J. H. Barlow, which arrived in Duluth tonight. The heavy storm of Friday night was safely weathered by the grounded vessel and unless the wind veers she will be comparatively safe.

LORD MINTO ESCAPES FLYING BOMB PRESIDENT DELIVERS TALK AT CHURCH

ENGLISH VICEROY OF INDIA AND HIS WIFE ARE SAVED FROM DEATH. TAFT ASSISTS IN GOLDEN JUBILEE OF ST. ALOYSIUS PARISH IN CAPITAL.

Ahmedabad, British India, Nov. 14.—Lord Minto, viceroy of India, and Lady Minto had a narrow escape yesterday from being killed by bombs. They were driving in a street when two bombs were thrown at their carriage. A dragon riding alongside spurred forward and with outstretched sabre, intercepted the first bomb, hurling it some little distance into a sand heap. The second bomb struck the viceroy's jemadar, a native lieutenant, holding an umbrella over Lady Minto, and fell harmlessly to the ground. Neither bomb exploded, as the soft sand acted as a buffer. On examination they were found to contain picric acid. Just prior to this, as the carriage passed through a street, a bomb exploded some distance away. Police and others, attracted by the explosion, ran up and found a man on the ground with his hand blown off. He proved to be an innocent bystander.

The bomb throwers escaped in the excitement.
Attempts have been made in India against Lord Minto, Lord Kitchener and Sir Andrew Fraser, lieutenant governor of Bengal, and many other officials and for a year or more there has been fear of an uprising against British rule.

The Pandora Copper Mining company has sued the Snowstorm Mining company for \$500 damages alleged to have been caused to its property by a defective flume built by the Snowstorm across two of the Pandora's claims. The Pandora seeks to enjoin the Snowstorm from reconstructing and operating the flume, which was recently broken and must be repaired for further use. It is claimed that water from the flume washed away the loading station on the Pandora property, destroyed one of the main tunnels and made the storage house of little use.
