Flathead Townsites Sell Well

With each town filled with men who are boosters to the core and who are possessed of the boundless enthusiasm of the homeseeker who has ended his pilgrimage and who is laboring to make his home the best in the state, it is no wonder that the people of western Montana are beginning to sit up and take notice of the five new towns, Arlee, Ravalli, Dixon, Roman and St. Ignatius, which passed out of the hands of Uncle Sam last week. The result of the townsite sale passed all hope and dreams. It was a marvel to those who saw it and to those who have been following similar sales throughout the country. Never before has the little Missoula land office seen such a sight as it witnessed last week. In times past it has seen perhaps, events which were more dramatic but those which were more gratifying and encouraging. Prospectors and lumbermen have in times past filled the room in their eagerness to file their claims, but they were there to get temporary holding only. During the last summer thousands passed through its doors to register for the land drawing on the reservation but these people, most of them, were trying to get something for nothing. They were drawn by the gambling spirit rather than the hope of securing a home or making a business investment. Last week the land office saw business men who were looking for a safe investment and who planned to make the property which they bought a place of business excitedly bidding against each other. It saw old residents of the reservation bidding their savings for lots in the towns where they had been born and in which they had always lived. The people who bought property on the reservation last week are going there with a spirit which promises much to the new towns and which can do nothing but make the Flathead valley the finest and most prosperous in the state.



A SIGHT OF THE PAST.

Last week's sale of townsite lands on the Flathead reservation marked the first active step of the white man into the ancient territory of the Flatheads. Within another year the broad plains which have never before known the sight of anything save the Red Man's teepee will be covered by the prosperous homes of the white man. The old teepee life, the picturesque sun-dances and celebrations and the very atmosphere of the Indian have gone forever. Hereafter the red man must settle down to civilized life and become lost to view.

METHODIST CHURCH BUYS LOTS

HOUSES OF WORSHIP TO BE BUILT ON RESERVATION AS NECESSARY.

Among the purchasers of lots in the townsite sale last week was Rev. J. W. Tait, pastor of the Missoula Methodist church. The need for suitable locations for church buildings in these towns was recognized by the Methodists here and they got in on the ground floor for lots in Roman, Dixon and St. Ignatius. It is not the intention of the church to build at once but as soon as the towns have grown sufficiently the lots will be utilized. Speaking of the matter yesterday Mr. Tait said:

"Just as soon as the towns are large enough to warrant such a move the churches will be built. The country there is bound to grow rapidly, and we intend to be ready for work when the proper time comes. If we can get a man to take charge of things soon the work will be started and churches will be built on the reservation."

FLATHEAD COUPLE ARE UNITED IN MARRIAGE

A wedding of general interest to Flathead people was performed in Missoula Saturday afternoon when Miss Molly Corey of Ravalli and Henry Moss of Arlee were united in marriage. The ceremony was performed by Rev. Henry Van Engelen in the parlors of the Shepard hotel. The groom was attended by his father, who is widely known on the reservation as "Sagebrush Bill" Moss, and the bride was accompanied by her mother. Agent Fred Morgan of the reservation and several of the local land office officials were in attendance, as were many of the friends of the couple.

Mr. Moss met his bride while working in Ravalli and the marriage followed shortly. The couple left last night for the west, where they will spend their honeymoon, returning to Arlee in a couple of weeks.
