

WILL PLACE CEREALS UNION SERVICE HELD ON MARKET IN HAMILTON

HAMILTON MILLING COMPANY TO BEGIN MANUFACTURE OF BREAKFAST FOODS.

Hamilton, Nov. 25.—(Special.)—The new machinery for the manufacture of Rival Flour, a high-grade oat meal manufactured from oats grown in the Bitter Root valley, has all been installed in the Hamilton flour mills and it is expected that within the next few days the mill will be turning out this new product, according to a statement made yesterday by W. B. Harlan, manager of the mills. When the mill was built plans were made for the installation of an oat meal plant, but the machinery was not put into the building until this summer. The large amount of high-grade oats produced in the valley makes the manufacture of oatmeal a feasible venture.

Mr. Harlan stated that it might be several weeks before the product of the mill could be perfected to a degree that would warrant its being put onto the market. The bulk oatmeal, put up in sacks containing from 10 to 50 pounds each, will be put onto the market first. Packages will be put onto the market as soon after as possible. If barley can be obtained the mill will manufacture another breakfast food, known as Pearl Barley. Wheat Flakes will be the third new product turned out by the local mill.

Mr. Harlan stated during the interview that as soon as they had the processes perfected they would turn their attention to raising the grade of the flour manufactured. By raising the grade of the best flour it will be possible to make the second grade of much better quality, thus giving it a better demand in the market.

A visit to the mills at this time convinces one that Hamilton is soon to have one of the best equipped flour mills in the entire west, and with the putting of these new products onto the market oats will sell at a better price.

WILL OPEN BUILDING WITH A GRAND BALL

Hamilton, Nov. 26.—(Special.)—After a layoff of several days on account of the incessant showers, work was resumed this morning in the chamber of commerce and trade buildings. With favorable weather the work will be completed in a short time.

Secretary M. L. H. Oden stated yesterday that plans had been made for a house-warming in the chamber of commerce building when it was finished. The new quarters will be thrown open to the public with a grand ball and reception. The people of Hamilton are taking considerable interest and pride in the new building and it is planned to dedicate it to the interests of the city and valley in a manner that will be a credit to Hamilton.

SMITH PLEADS GUILTY AND DRAWS ONE YEAR

Hamilton, Nov. 25.—(Special.)—When brought into the district court yesterday morning for trial on a charge of grand larceny, Henry Smith pleaded guilty to the charge and was sentenced by Judge Myers to one year in the state penitentiary at Deer Lodge. Smith robbed a man at Lake Como October 28.

E. H. Davis will be tried for first degree assault today. H. Lee McCulloch will appear for the state while George T. Baggs will act as attorney for the defendant.

ON ORIGINAL CONTEST TO PLAINS

W. C. T. U. AWARDS MEDALS IN TWO CLASSES—PRESIDENT GIVES ADDRESS.

Plains, Nov. 25.—Avery's hall was packed last night, the occasion being an oratorical contest under the auspices of the W. C. T. U. of Plains. The participants were children and the awards were silver and gold. Two classes took part and a medal was given to the winner of each class. Malcolm Stanton carried off one prize and Hazel Atchison the other. Mrs. George A. Toulmin, Mrs. Ed. Cherrington and Edward Adams were judges. Eleven children figured in the contest and every child displayed marked ability, thus making it a difficult matter for the judges to render a fair decision.

The local union was organized last August and last night was its first public meeting. It was opened by prayer by the Rev. W. H. Acheson, and his wife delivered the opening address. Rev. A. Roberts closed the meeting with prayer. Mrs. Atchison told of the first organization years ago and dwelt on the aims and purposes of the union. In closing, she said:

"The union has been a long time getting to Plains, but it is here at last; give it your hearty support. It is unwise to seek, led by others, like the blessed Master for whom we are working. We women of Plains are proud of our white ribbons, the emblem of purity. We believe in prayer; we are brave; yes, heroic. This is a movement under divine direction. Woman is looked upon as the weaker vessel, but God has chosen the weak things of the world to confound the mighty. Though women's hands are weak to fight, their voices are strong to pray, and with fingers of faith they'll open the gate to a brighter day."

"The medal contest work is one of the methods of W. C. T. U. used to instruct the young. It inculcates temperance principles and creates temperance sentiment. In behalf of the union of Plains I extend a hearty welcome."


