GUILTY OF ASSAULT SAYS JURY

VAN SCHMIDT IS TRIED ON A SERIOUS CHARGE AND SCATHINGLY ARRAIGNED.

The jury in the case of the state against Dr. John Van Schmidt, charged with assault in the third degree on Mrs. Olive Billups, brought in a verdict of guilty last evening, after being out about a half hour. The punishment was fixed at 30 days in the county jail, with the recommendation that sentence be suspended for 48 hours to give the man a chance to get out of town. The trial was held before Justice of the Peace Dyson and a jury in the police court room. It was begun at 10 o'clock in the morning and was given to the jury at about 5:30 in the evening. It was a long trial and tedious, but replete with sensational testimony, many spectators being present throughout the day. In his closing arguments, County Attorney Mulrone severely arraigned the defendant as a "moral pervert," and asked the jury to find him guilty and give him the limit, six months in the county jail and a fine of \$500.

CLAIMS "THE CLIMAX" IS AN INFRINGEMENT

Washington, Dec. 9.—Proceedings for an injunction, alleging infringement of copyright were instituted in the supreme court of the District of Columbia today by Edward L. Carter, a Washington playwright, against Joseph M. Weber, a New York theatrical manager, and the four actors producing in that city a play named "The Climax."

Mr. Carter claims he copyrighted a dramatic production under the title of

"The Climax," January 2, 1909, and that in producing the play Mr. Weber and the actors are infringing on his right.

INHERITANCE TAX DECISION.

Helena, Dec. 9.—(Special.)—In an opinion given today Attorney General Galen holds that where a testator directs that his real property be sold and converted into money, that such real estate and all its proceeds must be deemed personal property from the time of the testator's death, and therefore subject to the inheritance tax.

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
