

# HAMILTON TO HAVE BETTER SERVICE

### WATER WORKS SYSTEM IS TO BE EXTENDED SO AS TO REACH THE NORTH END.

Hamilton, Dec. 9.—W. O. Fisk, of the Valley Mercantile company, stated yesterday that the plans and specifications for the extension to the water mains of the city were in the hands of the contractors and as soon as arrangements could be made the contract would be let and the work started. The plans are for the extension of the mains north to cover all of Riverview and Riverview additions south of addition south of Adirondack avenue. This will bring water into the homes of a large number of residents of the city who have waited years for this same convenience.

Mr. Fisk also stated that it was probable that the entire system would be overhauled and many improvements made, it being planned to establish a system that would satisfy all the requirements of the rapidly growing city.

This new move on the part of the Hamilton Light & Water company will receive the hearty approval of all residents of the north end of town, who have for many years been without fire protection.
