TWO WOMEN FIGHT FOR CHILD

ADOPTION OF INFANT IS NOT PERMITTED—NEWS OF A DAY IN DISTRICT COURT.

Two women struggled yesterday in the district court for the possession of a child, Jerome Mitchell Kolaske, and, incidentally, a lot of family history was disclosed. Mrs. Pauline F. Hilscher of Spokane, grandmother of the child, had petitioned the court for adoption. Her desire was opposed by Mrs. S. W. Murdock, the infant's mother. It was brought out that the child's parents were divorced at Katspelt and that to the mother was given the custody of the boy, who has been cared for at the home of an aunt since the mother remarried. Yesterday Mrs. Murdock asserted that her husband wished to take the child to their home and, as she had never abandoned it, the court could do nothing but dismiss the petition of the grandmother.
