Managua, Nicaragua, Dec. 17--The governors of the department of Granada and Leon have been removed from office and replaced by men known to be favorable to Dr. Julian Irujo, minister general and to Dr. Madriz, both of whom have presidential aspirations. David Arellano, who was arrested last November in a celebration in honor of President Taft's election, which the government interpreted as a demonstration in favor of American annexation, was released from the penitentiary today. A reception committee of six has been appointed to meet Dr. Madriz on his arrival at Corinto Sunday. Heavy recruiting is going on here.

Mr. Wu expects to leave Washington with his family Monday for New York, to sail on the Lusitania for Europe, where he will sojourn for several months before returning to China.

GUNBOATS WILL GO TO WEST INDIAN WATERS

Washington, Dec. 17--The gunboats Dubuque and Paducah, which have been undergoing repairs at the navy yards at Portsmouth, N. H., will leave there about January 1 for Guantanamo, Cuba, according to a statement obtained from the navy department yesterday. They will go to Guantanamo to resume their usual duty in West Indian waters. It was explained, in event the troublesome situation in Nicaragua continues after the first of next month, it is believed these ships will be sent eventually to Costa Rica or Nicaragua.

FIVE GIRLS MISSING AFTER SERIOUS FIRE

Philadelphia, Dec. 17--At least five girls employed in the six-story building occupied by Schrack & Sherwood, manufacturers of undertakers' supplies, which was destroyed by fire last night, are missing and it is feared they lost their lives. One fireman, Joseph Toner, was killed. He gave up his life in searching for missing women. About 20 women were at work on the fifth floor when the fire was discovered on the floor below. Most of them, with the assistance of policemen and firemen escaped. Some were carried out unconscious. The jury was out 10 hours. Under the indictment Oliver Spitzer, a dock superintendent, John R. Coyle, Thomas Keboe, Edward A. Boyle and Patrick J. Hennessy, checkers, may be punished for the commission of two overt acts, the maximum penalty for each of which is two years' imprisonment and \$5,000 fine.

ASKS FOR DATA.

Washington, Dec. 17--With a view to reducing forest reserve administration expenses, and eliminating non-forest lands from the forest reserves and to the throwing open to entry all lands more valuable for agriculture, mining and grazing than for timber, embraced in the reserves, Representative Martin of Colorado introduced a resolution calling on the secretary of the interior for comparative data regarding forest reserve areas.

PLEAD NOT GUILTY.

Portland, Dec. 17--Pleas of not guilty were entered yesterday in the state circuit court by W. H. Moore, president; Henry Moore, director, and E. E. Lytle, director, of the defunct Oregon Trust & Savings bank of this city, which failed in August, 1937. The bankers are under indictment in connection with the failure of the institution. According to their attorneys they will demand separate trials.

ANOTHER OBSTACLE IN LAWYER'S WAY

Cincinnati, Dec. 17--Another obstacle has been encountered by Prosecutor Hunt in his efforts to disprove what became of the \$642,000 embezzled from the Big Four railroad by Charles L. Warriner, former local treasurer. According to a statement given out by the prosecutor tonight Henry Clews & Co., New York brokers, through whom Warriner claims to have lost vast sums in speculation, have refused to allow their books to be examined. The brokers claim that a Big Four accountant has already received all the information they have, but according to Mr. Hunt all the railroad officials could get was a slip showing that Warriner lost \$17,000 on the stock market. As more than \$300,000 of the defalcation remains unaccounted for, Warriner's losses, as reported by the Clews company, are insignificant.

Galveston, Tex., Dec. 17--The first court of civil appeals of this city today declared as unconstitutional the eight-hour telegraphers law, passed by the Texas legislature.


