DANES BRAND COOK AS MERE SWINDLER (Continued from Page One.) for I had learned to appreciate Cook as a devoted friend and an honest chap," said Captain Rowd Amundsen today. "The important question now is whether he is a swindler or merely ignorant. I prefer to believe that Dr. Cook was confident that he had arrived at the north pole. This must have been a fixed idea with him. If he is swindling he must have changed his character in the last 10 years."

Feeling of Relief. London, Dec. 21.—Dr. Cook's claims never obtained extensive support in England, and the tone of the morning newspapers is rather one of relief that the prolonged controversy is ended. The Standard in an editorial expresses the opinion that as Dr. Cook failed to convince the authority he himself had chosen, it would be absurd to ask for a further postponement of judgment. The Chronicle banters the Copenhagen authorities with first passing judgment and then making an inquiry. The Morning Post thinks that although the committee's decision is cautiously worded, it will scarcely be possible for Dr. Cook to take refuge in his original statement that his records are in Greenland. "There is no longer any dispute that Peary first reached the pole."
