

BATTLE FOR MONEY IN COURT

ESTATE OF VIRGINIAN WHO DIED
IN PARIS STAKE IN
LEGAL FIGHT.

New York, June 10.—The legal battle for the \$2,000,000 left by Benjamin Hart, a Virginian, who died in Paris two years ago, began today before Justice Greenbaum in the supreme court.

The action is brought by the executor and trustee under the will to oppose the will declared valid. Apposed to them are Mme. Josephine Laushest Isabel Hart Guillemain, Hart's adopted daughter and the wife of Jean Guillemain, French minister to Peru, and Mrs. Estelle Kitty Hart, divorced wife of the Virginian.

Hart in his will passed over Mme. Guillemain and bequeathed his estate to Mme. Antoinette Gabrielle de Bie of Paris, and his son, Michael Hart.

Madame de Bie, it is alleged by the adopted daughter, came into Hart's life after he was well along in years and obtained such control over the old man that she practically dominated his every act. The former wife contends that the divorce Hart obtained from her was not legal.

DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR RE-
MOVES OBJECTION TO POL-
SON PASSAGEWAY.

Billings, June 10.—(Special.)—The contract for the construction of the Fromberg-Scribner branch of the Burlington was awarded today to Crosby, Willis & Welch of Cowley, Wyo., by the head contracting firm of A. A. Guthrie & Co., of St. Paul. Work will begin immediately and ought to complete the line before the end of the year. The road will be 50 miles in length and by it the main line, being built to origin junction in southwestern Wyoming, will be connected with the Billings & Northern of the Great Northern system, thus forming a trunk system from the gulf to the north Pacific coast.

Washington, June 10.—(Special.)—Authority was issued today to the Flathead county commissioners for the construction of a bridge across the Flathead river at Polson. Senator Dixon obtained consent from the war department some time ago, but the interior department held up the official permit on the ground that a water power site was affected. On presentation of the matter by the Montana senator, the department today granted permission for the construction of the bridge.

Assurances were given today by the House judiciary committee that the bill granting Montana another judge would be favorably reported in the house. If possible the report will be made during this session, if not, certainly at the beginning of next session. Assurance is given by members of committee collectively and individually, which makes matters absolutely sure.
