Notice is hereby given to the owners of lands situated within proposed special improvement district No. 7, in the city of Missoula, Montana, that at a meeting of the council of the city of Missoula, held on August 8, 1910, the following resolution, No. 88A, was passed and is hereby adopted and adoption by the said city council at a meeting thereof to be held at the city council chamber in the city hall in the city of Missoula, Montana, on Monday, August 9, 1910, at 8 o'clock p. m. of said day, W. A. LOGAN, City Clerk.

Resolution No. 88A.

A resolution to create special improvement district No. 7, in the city of Missoula, Montana, for the purpose of building and constructing cement sidewalks, curbs, culverts, street crossings, making and planting grass plots, parking, planting trees, boulevards, grading, improving gravel or crushed stone upon the boulevard and placing gravel or crushed stone upon and along the driveway, changing fire hydrants where necessary, and for the purpose of making other improvements hereinafter set forth and described, the payment of assessments for which are to be made in installments, and are to extend over a period of eight years, and the cost of which special improvements, (less any amount which may be payable by any person or corporation occupying any part of the street under franchise) of all improvements with the special improvement district hereby created, including the cost of street and alley intersections, shall be paid by the entire district, each lot or parcel of land within the district to be assessed for that part of the whole cost which its area bears to the whole area of the entire district, exclusive of streets, alleys and public places; and

Whereas, an approximate estimate of the cost of the improvements hereinafter set forth has been made, and is hereby declared to be as follows: \$125,000 per lot of 30 feet wide and 130 feet deep and a total cost of \$23,250,000. Be it resolved by the council of the city of Missoula, that the special improvement district hereby created be, and the same is hereby designated and known as special improvement district No. 7.

That the boundaries of said special improvement district No. 7 are hereby fixed and described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a point where the southerly line of Tremont street is intersected by the center line of alley running northerly and southerly through Block 14, of South Missoula addition to the town of Missoula, and running thence northerly and along the southerly line of Tremont street, to an intersection with the north boundary line of South Missoula addition to the town of Missoula, (being the section line dividing sections 21 and 28, in Township 15, North of Range 12, west of the 100th meridian, and thence westerly along said last described line to an intersection with the center line of alley running northerly and southerly through blocks 15, 17, 34, 42, 55, 69, 77, 89 and 92, to an intersection with the South boundary line of said South Missoula addition, (being the center line running easterly and westerly through section 25, township 13, north of range 12, west); thence easterly along said last described line to an intersection with the center line of alley running northerly and southerly through blocks 90, 76, 70, 55, 45, 33, 10, and 14, to an intersection with the southerly line of Tremont street, the place of beginning.

Said special improvement district No. 7, comprising all of lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 14; lots 13 to 20, inclusive, block 15; lots 13 to 24, inclusive, block 17; lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 22; lots 13 to 24, inclusive, block 34; lots 13 to 24, inclusive, block 42; lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 43; lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 55; lots 13 to 24, inclusive, block 56; lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 70; lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 76; lots 13 to 24, inclusive, block 77; lots 13 to 24, inclusive, block 89; lots 1 to 12, inclusive, block 90; lots 21 to 24, inclusive, block 92 in the South Missoula addition to the town of Missoula, and all being in the city of Missoula, county of Missoula and state of Montana.

That the character of the improvements which are to be made in said special improvement district are as follows, to wit: To grade and boulevard the whole of Stephens avenue, 93 feet in width between curbs, placing thereon gravel to the depth of either four (4) or six (6) inches; to build and construct concrete cement curbs immediately adjoining said roadway, and on each side thereof, each of said curbs to be placed 15 feet from the property line of the 15 feet line on each side of said avenue to be divided and utilized as follows: A strip 2 feet wide adjacent to the property line and also a strip 8 feet wide adjacent to the curb to be parked and arranged for grass plots; trees to be planted in a row along the center line of the strip adjacent to the curb, trees spaced 39 feet apart; concrete cement sidewalks 5 feet wide to be built between strips of parking on each side of said street; concrete cement crossings to be built across intersecting streets; fire hydrants to be changed from present location where necessary; irrigation lands to be placed at necessary points.

That said improvements contemplated at the present time are to be confined to the following part of the district: The whole of Stephens avenue including all street intersections and between the easterly and westerly lines of said Stephens avenue; and further be it

Resolved, That the 15th day of August, 1910, at 8 o'clock p. m. be, and the same is hereby designated as the time, and the council chamber at the city hall in the city of Missoula, Montana, be the place when and where the council will be in session and will hear objections or protests, if any there be, to the creation of said special improvement district, or to the making of said improvements, and any and all persons who are the owners or agents of owners of any lot or parcel of land within said proposed improvement district, shall at said time and place have the right to appear at said meeting, either in person or by counsel, and object to or protest against the creation of said special improvement district, or to the making of said improvements, and to the adoption of this resolution; and further

That the city clerk be, and he is hereby instructed by the city council, to have this resolution published in The Daily Missoulian, a

newspaper printed and published in said city of Missoula, for at least five days before the time set for hearing objections and protests to the creation of said special improvement district, and the making of said improvements, and final adoption of this resolution. And it is hereby declared the intention of the city council to finally adopt this resolution on Monday, the 15th day of August, 1910, at said meeting of the city council, unless objections or protests are made at said time and place, by owners or agents of owners representing more than one-half in area of all of the property which would be assessed to defray the cost of said improvements.

Finally adopted by the city council this 8th day of August, 1910, and approved by the mayor this 8th day of August, 1910.
