REVENUES FOR JUNE SHOW BIG GAIN

NORTHERN PACIFIC WILL HAVE GROSS INCREASE OF \$650,000 DURING MONTH.

The Northern Pacific for June will show a gain in gross of \$650,000, most of which was saved for net, says a Chicago dispatch to the Boston Monitor.

July earnings almost hold their own, which was rather more than expected in view of the enormous passenger business a year ago.

Northern Pacific has begun a series of economies in anticipation of general business contraction. One affects the passenger department, which handles more through business than any other northern transcontinental.
