The German Advance XIX.—The Prussian Suffrage Problem.

(By Frederic J. Haskin.)

The most acute political quarrel in Germany is that occasioned by the demand of the socialists and radicals for a reform of the Prussian electoral system. Under this system the wealthy classes are given absolute and complete power to control the politics of the kingdom.

But Kaiser or king, William II had some doubts not to assert his absolute power in excess of that guaranteed to him by the federal imperial constitution.

Next morning the editor of a great socialist paper printed across his front page an invitation for all the people to believe in suffrage reform.

During the first few months of this year there was rarely a Sunday that did not witness some scene of mob violence in some Prussian city in connection with the protests of the people against the Prussian suffrage system.

The imperial constitution grants the right of universal manhood suffrage to all Germans, just as does the constitution of the United States.

In Prussia the voters are divided into three classes. Every male adult who pays an income tax is entitled to vote, but his vote is not direct.

Each class of electors in each parliamentary constituency meets and each chooses one elector. Then the three electors, as chosen by the three classes of voters separately, meet and choose the deputy to represent the constituency in the Prussian diet.

NEW DRAINAGE SYSTEM FOR CITY OF KALISPELL

Kalispell, Aug. 22.—Plans for the construction of a drainage system, which will lower Smith lake or Lower Ashley lake three feet and straighten the inlet for four or five miles, were announced by Engineer P. E. Marsh of the Ashley irrigation district today.

Below the lake the outlet will have to be excavated and a channel cut for a mile and a half in loose bouldry formation in order to reach the irrigation headgates.
