Garbage Notice to Tenants and Property Owners.

Ordinance No. 255 of the city of Missoula provides that the city council shall annually let a contract to some person for the removal of all garbage, refuse, ashes, etc., in the city of Missoula.

No person except the official scavenger of the city of Missoula can remove or haul away garbage or refuse from any of the streets or alleys, or from any private premises in the city of Missoula.

Every tenant or owner must provide a metal garbage can with a tight-fitting cover which must be kept in the rear of the premises occupied, and so as to be accessible for the purposes of removal. No garbage or refuse must be placed in barrels or boxes, but must be placed in metal garbage cans which do not leak and which have tight-fitting covers.

The owner or occupant of premises must pay to the city scavenger for the removal of contents of garbage cans, ashes and waste the amount which he is authorized to collect therefor under his contract with the city of Missoula.

Upon presentation to the owner or tenant by the city scavenger of a bill for the removal of garbage, refuse, ashes, waste, etc., showing the number of cubic feet removed, together with the price per cubic foot for removal contained in his contract with the city of Missoula, the same must be paid by such owner or tenant. If the amount due remains unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days, the city attorney must commence an action in the police court of the city of Missoula against such owner or tenant for the recovery of the amount due, and such owner or tenant shall also be liable to a fine for violating the provisions of ordinance No. 255.

Metal garbage cans must be provided immediately for all stores, dwellings, apartment houses, etc., and so placed that the contents can be removed by the city scavenger when necessary, and the fees for removal must be paid by the owner or tenant of the premises.

The provisions of ordinance No. 255 must be complied with by all property owners and tenants, and failure to do so will subject the offenders to the penalties therein provided.
