MRS. SHONTS' JEWELRY IS HELD FOR DUTIES



BEETLES EAT PINES IN WEST

FORESTRY REPORT SHOWS THAT MUCH DAMAGE IS DONE BY BUGS IN THE TIMBER.

A report has been issued by the forestry bureau showing the character and extent of the depredations of insects on forest trees and methods of their control.

The report speaks of the outbreak of the mountain pine beetle in 1909 in the Snowy mountains section of Montana, adjacent to and within the Jefferson National forest, involving at one time more than 1,500 infested and dying trees.



Further digestion of the president's message appears to have convinced Wall street's sober element that the recommendations contained therein are entirely in accord with the conservatism so often expressed by the administration and for the best interest for the financial, commercial and industrial worlds.
