CREW OF MOTORBOAT HAS A PERILOUS TIME

New York, Dec. 19.—Five members of the crew of the motorboat Berbece arrived here today on the liner Numidian from the West Indies, with a story of a perilous cruise from Norfolk, during which their little craft was swept clear of all portable articles and Mate Campbell washed overboard. The mate was standing by the companion rail when a wave carried him over the starboard rail into the sea. He managed to grab the stern gun-

whale, and after a struggle, pulled himself aboard. On the fifth day they sighted a Norwegian steamer, crept up in its wake, and after obtaining their location they steered away for Bermuda and landed there on Thursday.

INDIAN MOONSHINERS.

Juneau, Alaska, Dec. 19.—A raid by a detachment of marines from the revenue cutter Rush has resulted in the breaking up of an Indian moonshiners' camp at the Indian village of Hoonah. Mandy Waring, a squaw, who was arrested, is alleged to have made a confession implicating her husband and other members of the tribe.

ELOPING GIRL GETS MONEY.

Philadelphia, Dec. 19.—By the terms of the will of the late Robert Buist, the seedsman of this city, Roberta B. De Janon, his grandchild, who disappeared from this city with a hotel waiter a year ago and was found in Chicago, is given in trust the bulk of his estate, which is valued at about \$500,000.

CANDIDATE FOR TOGA.

Weston, W. Va., Dec. 19.—Andrew Edmiston of this city tonight formally announced his entry into the race for the democratic nomination for United States senator, succeeding Nathan B. Scott of Wheeling, republican. Mr. Edmiston has been a leading party man for many years.

TRESPASSER IN CABIN IS INSTANTLY KILLED

Weaverville, Cal., Dec. 19.—Death that had been secretly arranged for its luckless victim befell Frank Smith today when he entered the cabin of Harry W. Luecock, four miles below the Burnt Ranch postoffice, on the banks of the Trinity river. As Smith opened the door the trigger of a shotgun that had been loaded set and aimed at the only opening in the little shack was released and a charge

of buckshot fired into his chest. He was instantly killed.

Luecock left his cabin six weeks ago for a visit to his old home in San Luis Obispo, before leaving he posted a placard near the door bearing the words, "Death to anyone who enters." Then he set the gun with the muzzle pointing toward the door, tied a piece of string from the doorknob to the gun trigger and left the trap to claim its victim.
