
MONTANA TEACHERS AT BILLINGS

"An Interesting Book from Cover to Cover" MONTANA "THE LAND OF SHINING MOUNTAINS" BY KATHERINE E. JUDSON. A VERY DESCRIPTIVE AND HISTORICAL ACCOUNT OF MONTANA, WRITTEN FOR CHILDREN'S READING IN SCHOOLS OR AT HOME. THE story begins with a description of the land as it would appear to the reader if he could see it before the first white man trod its valleys. An account is then given of the Lewis and Clarke Expedition along the Missouri River, when the Falls of the Missouri were first seen by white men, and other chapters deal with the Indian tribes, life at the forts, and Blackfoot enmity. Custer's last fight is graphically described. Vivid pictures are drawn of the perils of the trappers and pony express riders, and of the gold rush. The book is fully illustrated from photographs, contains maps, and an appendix gives a short annotated bibliography of books on Montana and the text of the State Constitution. The lack of a popular work on Montana for young people has been felt especially in educational circles, and Miss Judson's book has been largely used in the schools of Montana. 75 cents net.
