MINERS BADLY BURNED.

Lexington, Ky., Jan. 7.—Fifteen miners were badly burned today and 50 others narrowly escaped by an explosion in the Big Hill Coal company mines in Lee county. Men were blown from far down in the shaft clear above the surface, but so far as has been learned, none was killed.

The explosion took place just as the men were leaving the workings. A premature shot was fired which ignited and blew the men bodily from the shaft. One man was blown over a small hill 50 yards away and badly hurt. Fifteen others were badly burned, and three of them may not recover.
