Washington, Oct. 8.—The Germans of the United States, as represented by the German-American alliance now in convention here, today signified their wish that Germany enter into negotiations with the United States for a general arbitration treaty similar to those with Great Britain and France now pending in the United States senate. The delegates passed a resolution asking the senate to ratify the two treaties without amendment.
