

**PRELATES NOTIFIED  
OF PROMOTION**

**ARCHBISHOPS FALCONIO, FARLEY AND O'CONNELL GET OFFICIAL NOTICE.**

Washington, Oct. 30.—Monsignor Diomedeo Falconio, the apostolic delegate to the United States, and Archbishops O'Connell of Boston and Farley of New York, official notice of whose selection in addition to the college of cardinals, was received here today, probably will sail for Rome not later than November 10. Monsignor Falconio received his summons today to attend the consistory at Rome November 27. He does not expect to return to America, as his position will be advisory to the pope. Rev. B. Correll, the auditor of the papal delegation, will act as charge d'affaires until the appointment of a successor to Monsignor Falconio.

Monsignor Falconio said he hoped to be able to sail by the date mentioned. He expressed his appreciation for the uniform kindness of the American people since he came to Washington. "I have become greatly attached to the American people, because I am an American," said he. "My work in Washington as representative of the vatican has been most pleasant. I leave here with many regrets, but must obey the call to other fields."

**Defeat for Modernism.**  
Boston, Oct. 30.—Archbishop O'Connell's elevation means a crushing defeat for modernism in this country which has used, as one of its specious arguments, that American Catholic interests were not understood, or were ignored by the vatican, said the Rev. Ambrose F. Roche, one of the archbishop's closest advisers. "No one can question the extraordinary ability, courage and prudence of the new cardinal and no one dares to insinuate that he is not intensely loyal to the church and to the flag of his native land."

**American Pope?**  
Rome, Oct. 30.—Comments on the approaching consistory, when 17 cardinals, including three from the United States, will be created, continue to emphasize the great significance of Pope Pius' decision to grant American four representatives in the sacred college. By some, it is asserted that the way is being paved for the advent of an American pope.

It is pointed out that the largest body of Catholics in the world is to be found in the United States and its possessions, the Philippine Islands, Hawaii, Porto Rico and Guam. Not only are the Catholics of America superior in number, but in deep religious feeling, loyalty to the Holy See, in wealth and generosity. An Irish-American pope is suggested for the day when it shall be considered no longer necessary for the papacy to be held by Italians.

The American college faculty and students are rejoicing especially over the elevation of Archbishop Farley of New York and Archbishop O'Connell of Boston, as they are alumni of the college.

The former was one of the original 13 students when the college was founded by Pope Pius IX.

The objections made by some that Monsignor Kennedy, rector of the American college, being an American, cannot be appointed apostolic delegate at Washington, are refuted by the fact that the pope nominated Monsignor Fruehwirth as papal nuncio to Munich, which arrangement is working well. Moreover, Monsignor Kennedy is described as a Romanist to the backbone.

**WALLACE BANKERS  
PLEAD NOT GUILTY**

Wallace, Oct. 30.—(Special.)—Harry L. Day, Eugene B. Day and August Paulsen, millionaire owners of the Hercules mine; Stanley A. Easton, general manager of the Bunker Hill & Sullivan mine; John H. Nordquist, civil and mining engineer and county commissioner; G. Scott Anderson, lumber and hardware merchant, and E. S. Wyman, former cashier, all officers or directors in the defunct State Bank of Commerce, appeared in district court this morning, this being the time set for entering pleas.

August Paulsen, indicted by the grand jury for making a false report of the bank's condition and concurring in publication of a false report of the corporation's business, pleaded not guilty to the later charge and filed a demurrer to the former which will be argued November 6.

All the other defendants, through attorneys, filed motions to quash the indictments. These will be argued November 20.

**LUMBERJACK BEATEN  
IN WOODS OF IDAHO**

Kellogg, Idaho, Oct. 30.—(Special.)—Lumbermen working in a camp two miles north of Kellogg, on their way into the woods this morning, found one of their number, Nick Drago, 70 years old, lying unconscious in a pool of blood by the roadside, where he had been dragged after a terrible beating administered Sunday night by an unknown person. Drago was brought to the hospital in Wallace this afternoon and regained consciousness after treatment, long enough to give the sheriff a good description of the man who beat him and then robbed him of his watch and \$30.

Drago's recovery is doubtful, the treatment received being more serious on account of his age and the all-night exposure following. No clues have been obtained to the assailant.


