VIGILANTES TALKED IN GOTHAM

GUN FIGHTS BETWEEN GANGS DRIVING DECENT PEOPLE TO DESPERATION.

New York, July 4.—As a result of the gun fights between factional gangs which have made various sections of New York resemble a mining camp of the wildest times, suggestions are actually being put forward here for the organization of a committee of vigilantes similar to those of early frontier days for the purpose of ridding the city of the gang leaders whose highest ambition seems to be the taking of human life.
