XII.—The Second Jackson Victory.

There was no greater speculation a year ago whether Roosevelt would be a candidate for a third term than there was in 1876 whether Jackson would be a candidate for a second term.

While speculation was at its highest pitch, Senator Grady of Tennessee, delivered a speech in which he bade the country wait. He said that conditions might make it so that Jackson would not be a candidate.

Not long afterward Pennsylvania nominated him for a second term, and a few weeks later the democrats in the New York legislature seconded the nomination.

The democrats in the Pennsylvania legislature reiterated their faith in "Old Hickory" and assured him that the country again wanted him for president.

During his first administration Van Buren resigned from the cabinet, saying that he was a candidate for the presidency after Jackson should retire.

Meanwhile Clay was at his home at Ashland cherishing his grudge against Jackson, and hoping to win in a third race with "Old Hickory."

But while things were happening with Jackson and Clay there were other parts of the political world where things were doing.

brought into existence an anti-Masonic party, a party which proved very strong in several state elections. A national convention of the anti-Masons met in Philadelphia in September, 1830, and called delegates to a convention to meet in Baltimore a year hence for the nomination of candidates for the presidency and vice-presidency.

But when McLean saw he could not unite all the contending forces he withdrew, and the convention nominated William Wirt, one of the grand old men of Virginia, and Amos Ellmaker of Pennsylvania. Wirt was in Baltimore at the time, and delivered his speech of acceptance to the convention. It was about as remarkable a scene as when the democratic convention of 1804 received the Parker "sold telegram."

The democrats met in Baltimore and nominated Van Buren for vice president, but held that Jackson was so much the universal choice for first place that he needed no nomination at their hands.

With the entries in for the race began the jockeying for position. Clay wanted to make the United States bank the issue. The democrats not being willing that it should be the "paramount issue," but were glad to help Mr. Clay bring it to the fore.

Clay had about as much chance of winning while espousing the cause of the bank as a present day candidate might have who would want to charter Wall Street. The further fact that he, a Mason, was conniving with the anti-Masons, and although the author of the Tariff of Abominations, was in collusion with "Old Hickory" and the Nullifiers, added to Jackson's strength.

In making up the electoral tickets in the various states local conditions were somewhat consulted. In Pennsylvania the democrats left Van Buren off and substituted the name of Wilkins, Jackson leaders made no objection to this.

When the returns were all in, the anti-Masons had carried only the states of Vermont, Clay carried Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland and Kentucky.

Do you believe, Mr. Voter, that a candidate really intends, if he could, to bust the trusts, who will not make you a confidant of his plan before election? Mr. Taft's views are too far out of the running to require serious consideration.
