**MARKET CONDITIONS IMPROVE**  
 GENERAL LIST IS BETTER, BUT UNION PACIFIC AND SOUTHERN PACIFIC SUFFER.  
 New York, Dec. 19.—There was an unmistakable improvement today in the stock market. After a brief period of uncertainty early in the day, prices moved upward and in the remainder of the session showed increased stability and underlying firmness. Stocks were in small supply and holders apparently were reluctant to dispose of them at current prices. Bear traders, in consequence, were able to make little headway.  
 Announcement after the close yesterday that the Union Pacific management had been unable to agree with the attorney general upon a plan of dissolution, aroused some apprehension as to the effect on Harriman stocks. Both Union Pacific and Southern Pacific were weak at the opening. Union Pacific sold at 154, a

loss of two points, and Southern Pacific at 144 1/2, the low point of the decline and a loss overnight of 1 1/2.  
 Other stocks gave way at the same time, but opening prices generally were the lowest and the upward swing soon set in. Bear covering assisted in the rise which resulted in a rise of from one to four points among a number of important issues. Union Pacific rose nearly four points from its early low quotation and the copper shares, Steel and American Tobacco, developed market strength. Reading was advanced smartly but did not touch the high mark reached after the announcement yesterday of the dividend increase.  
 Although there was little change in the local money market, bankers are unwilling to release funds in view of the requirements of the year-end period.  
 Bonds were irregular. Total sales, par value, \$1,138,000.
