


ANNUAL STATE POULTRY SHOW TO BE MONTANA'S VERY BEST

The annual Montana Poultry show, which opened in Helena yesterday, will be the biggest and most successful ever held in Montana, according to President L. W. Austin of the state association. Mr. Austin has been in Helena for several weeks preparing for the big exhibition, which is to be held from January 28 to February 3. He has lined up a lot of big exhibitors and promises the state a dandy show. In a published interview last week Mr. Austin said:

"The state show will be held here January 28 to February 3, inclusive, and will be the final show for the winter. Local poultry shows have been in progress all over the state. The best birds were picked out and kept in show condition for the state show, which is the final test, the best specimens to win, and when you come out victorious at this next state show that is saying you have the best birds in the state and even more, for at this show there will be several entries from outside the state and Canada.

"By all means send some chickens to the show. Amateurs and artisans are benefited. Absolutely the shortest

course to poultry perfection is found in the shows.

"Write or phone Dr. J. D. Sutphen, secretary-treasurer, Power Block, for an entry blank. Poultry fanciers increase so fast every year that it is impossible to keep the mailing list up to date and I fear not every one who is interested got a premium list which contained entry blanks. The amateur is usually backward about sending birds to the shows, his main excuse being, 'I know I won't win anything,' or 'I'd send if I only knew I'd win.' These are the interesting features of the show room—'Who's going to win,' and the oldest exhibitor does the most guessing. But what you want as a beginner is experience. Information. When you have some specimens at the show your interest is there, you'll be there and rub elbows with other poultrymen. Your birds will be alongside the winners if you don't win yourself, and there they are side by side to compare and see for yourself why one bird was better than the other. Meet the poultry judges who have examined every bird in many shows, whose ideal is the best specimen wherever he goes. The judge will be glad to talk

with you and answer questions, also show you quality and defect.

"While at the show if you are undecided as to the kind of chickens you wish to keep now is the time to make your choice. Here are all the kinds in their near perfection and the selection of one kind and success begin at the same time. After you see specimens of the different breeds, all true to their type you will never be satisfied to see a bunch of all kinds and colors—a nameless lot (nondescript) decorating your premises. Every one in and near Helena has an opportunity to put their birds on exhibition at the least cost and trouble. Compare yourself with the fancier who has to ship his birds clear across the state, trusting to weather and express companies, when you can bring yours and set them down in the show room. I have yet to see the person who is sorry of the first effort in the show room, and I have seen some great surprises in the way of winning for those who knew they wouldn't. Don't wait till the last minute to write out your entry; come along and take part in Helena's first poultry show and the biggest and best yet in Montana."
