

POISONOUS PLANTS OF WESTERN RANGES

FOREST SERVICE HAS DONE GOOD WORK DURING YEAR TO AID STOCKMEN.

Among the several important lines of work that has been carried on during this year by the forest service has been the investigations of poisonous plants that infest the stock ranges of Montana and Idaho. This work has been carried on in the field by the rangers who have collected in the two states mentioned a total of 1,400 plant specimens, some known to be poisonous to livestock and others known to be poisonous.

This work has been undertaken to meet the request of the stockmen for practical information in handling livestock on the range. The plants are identified in Washington, D. C., by experts of the bureau of plant industry. Full information concerning each plant is furnished the rangers who come in direct contact with the stockmen and to others who may be interested.

Scientific Research. It is a well known fact that overgrazing by either sheep or cattle results in a serious damage to the range. Experts tell us that this may very often be avoided if the life history of the plants which supply the forage is understood. Many of the valuable forage plants are annuals, that is, they reproduce themselves each year from seed. If, however, the range is closely grazed before the seeds mature the plant cannot reproduce itself the following season. Perennials, those plants which spring from roots each season, are likewise gradually killed if given no opportunity to produce seed and to store a reserve food supply in the roots. The remedy offered for this situation is a rotation system of grazing, which provides for holding the stock off of those areas where the forage is thin or damaged until the grasses mature and ripen the seed. For the balance of the season the area may be grazed as usual. Different portions of the grazing allotment are selected during succeeding years until the entire area is reseeded. This process must be repeated periodically.

BOZEMAN MEN NAMED IN SERIOUS CHARGES

Bozeman, Nov. 28.—(Special.)—Warrants were issued tonight for the arrest of Joseph Ruerup, Sr., and Henry J. Lowe, on the charge in each case of a statutory offense against a young girl. Ruerup was put under and gave \$5,000 bail bond, but Lowe remains in the custody of his attorneys, Hartman & Hartman, upon their representations that he is unable to leave his bed. Ruerup has been for several years the proprietor of the Gem theater. Lowe has been a practicing attorney in Bozeman for about a year, coming here from Mansfield, Ohio. He has been interested for the past few weeks with others in the management of the Globe picture theater, until the present charges were made against them. Both men bore excellent reputations.

BUSH HELD BLAMELESS FOR KILLING AGED MAN

Brainerd, Minn., Nov. 28.—(Special.)—The coroner's jury at the inquest over the remains of Louis T. Miller, the aged flagman of the Northern Pacific railway, who was accidentally struck and killed Wednesday evening by the automobile driven by Joe "Bulldog" Leslie Bush, the Philadelphia Athletic world's series pitcher, deliberated 10 minutes and returned a verdict stating that Miller's death was unavoidable and purely accidental, and no blame is placed on Bush. Miller was a veteran in the civil war, 72 years old, born in West Virginia, and the Grand Army posts of Brainerd and Staples have united to give him burial.
