ONE-EGG MUFFINS

2 cups flour; 2 slightly rounded teaspoons K C Baking Powder; 1 level teaspoonful sugar; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 1 egg; 1/2 cup milk or water; 1/2 cup butter or lard; 1 egg; 1 cup water or milk.

GRAHAM MUFFINS

1 cup graham flour; 1 cup pastry flour; 2 level teaspoonfuls K C Baking Powder; 1 to 2 level teaspoonfuls sugar; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; 1 egg; 1/2 cup milk or water; 1/2 cup butter or lard; 1 egg; 1 cup water or milk.
