

RALLY COMES LATE BUT IS STRONG AT THE END

UPWARD MOVEMENT IS INSPIRED BY A REPORT OF CHANGE IN MISSOURI PACIFIC.

New York, April 30.—Quotations moved upward decisively in the late trading today after several hours of uncertain operations.

The needed impulse came in the last half-hour in the shape of circumstantial reports that control of Missouri Pacific would pass into new and powerful hands.

Conditions favored the market at the opening. London had established a range of higher prices and bought stocks here.

Prospects of a strong bank statement and the improving outlook for a successful solution of the Mexican problem influenced the money market.

Bonds were irregular. Total sales, par value, \$1,415,000.

BATTLE AT TAMPECO IS BECOMING FIERCE

WARD LINE STEAMER IS FIRED UPON BY REBELS AND IS SAVED BY FEDERALS.

Washington, April 30.—Rear Admiral Mayo at Tampico reported to the navy department tonight that the Ward line steamer Antilla, flying the Cuban flag, was fired upon and held up in the river there yesterday by constitutionalists, but later steamed into port under cover of fire upon the rebels from the Mexican federal gunboat Vera Cruz.

The battlesman of the Antilla was wounded by the rebel fire and the steamer anchored, sending out wireless S. O. S. signals. Admiral Mayo sent alongside a boat with his aide and a medical officer from the flagship Des Moines.

Other officers of the foreign men-of-war off the port, headed by Captain Doughty of the British cruiser Hermione, called upon the constitutionalist commander for an explanation.

The constitutionalist officers declared that they proposed in future to prevent any merchant vessels entering Tampico in order to keep supplies and stores from the federals.

Soon after this conference, Admiral Mayo's report said, the gunboat Vera Cruz opened fire upon the constitutionalists, and then the Antilla, under cover of the shelling, proceeded up the river to the wharves. Shells from the Vera Cruz set fire to two big oil freighters at the Waters-Pierce refinery.

Navy officials said here no official notice would be taken by Admiral Mayo of the Antilla incident.

EAGLE OF WALLACE CANNOT BE FOUND

WELL-KNOWN MEMBER OF AERIE HAS DROPPED OUT OF SIGHT MYSTERIOUSLY.

Wallace, April 30.—(Special.)—John Murphy, a member of the local aerie of Eagles and for a long time a resident of Pine creek district, is missing and local members of the order fear that the man has met with an accident or has committed suicide.

Yesterday a delegation from the Wallace aerie set out to seek the man who has been missing since Sunday. No report from them has been received.

Murphy had been of a morose disposition for several days and had borrowed an automatic pistol Sunday morning for the purpose of "killing a squirrel."

When he failed to return to his home Sunday evening search parties were organized. Traces of the man were found at the George Morrow ranch, but neither Murphy nor his body was located.

COLOMBIAN TREATY HAS MANY FOES

WASHINGTON, April 30.—All efforts to obtain immediate ratification by the senate of the treaty with Colombia providing for the payment of \$25,000,000 by the United States to end the 19-year dispute over the succession of Panama, and which gave that country's warships the free use of the Panama canal, was practically abandoned by the administration pending the settlement of the difference with Mexico.

MILITIA ARRESTED.

WALSBERG, Col., April 30.—United States regulars under Captain G. Smith, commanding troop G, Fifth United States cavalry, tonight arrested six militiamen after complaints had been made that a saloon at the head of Seventh street, near the Walsen mine, had been looted. The prisoners, all privates, were turned over to the militia officers. Fifty bottles of liquor and 25 boxes of cigars were recovered.

The saloon said to have been robbed was used as a fortress by strikers during the recent fighting. Strikers in the saloon fired upon the militiamen.

Captain Smith was in conference today with local officials, militia officers and strike leaders.

MARTIAL LAW.

BOULDER, Colo., April 30.—The Boulder citizens committee today decided to ask Governor Ammons to declare martial law throughout the county. A committee of women from Louisville urged the district attorney here today to close the Louisville saloons.
