

LUSK STARTS FUND

FOR BIG PIG CONTEST

BOYS AND GIRLS OF STATE HAVE CHANCE TO WIN EASY MONEY AT THE STATE FAIR.

F. S. Lusk of this city, president of the First National bank, is one of the men who are fully convinced that more dairy cattle and many more pigs must be bred before the Montana farmer is to come into his own. Mr. Lusk is much in earnest in his efforts to have more of both kinds of stock raised in the state, and to create a larger interest he has donated \$100 to be used as prize money for a pig contest for the girls and boys of the state at the Montana state fair. The fair board has donated a like amount, and Secretary Brotenstein has prepared the rules and regulations to govern the contest. He says that many of the boys and girls have heard of the offer and are writing him letters to know what they have to do to get a chance to win some of the money. He thinks that this will be one of the keenest contests of the whole fair.

The prizes will be distributed as follows:

Rules to govern the contest are as follows: Pigs must be pure grade or grade. Boys and girls under 15 years eligible. Awards will be made on fattest and best pig.

All pigs farrowed after March 1, 1914, may compete in the under-six-months class, and all pigs farrowed after September 1, 1913, may compete in the six-months and under-twelve-months class.

Entry slip must show kind of foods used in fattening and the quantity, and the manner in which fed. Use regular entry slips.

Entries close September 12. Each contestant may enter only one pig in each class.
