

MOUNT LASSEN HOT AND SPITTING STEAM

CALIFORNIA PEAK BREAKS LOOSE AFTER RESTING TWO CENTURIES.

Redding, Cal., June 1.—Mount Lassen is in eruption. A forest ranger who investigated the cause of clouds of steam and smoke seen issuing from the mountain at 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon, reported today that a new crater has broken from the side of the mountain and that volcanic ashes, mud and sand cover the ground for an area of 300 feet around the opening.

The forest ranger said he had found an aperture 20 feet wide and 40 feet long with lateral fissures running in all directions, and that a cloud of steam and smoke hung above the spot. Founders of varying sizes had been thrown up by the eruption, he said, and ashes were on the ground as far away from the crater as three miles. Reports reaching the forest supervisor today were that a greater cloud than ever is hanging over the mountain.

A Long Rest.

San Francisco, June 1.—Information obtained at the office of the United States geodetic survey today shows that the latest violent volcanic eruption in the Mount Lassen district occurred about 200 years ago, the first violent outbreak occurring at least a century before the American revolution. The estimated ages of the trees still standing in the deposits support those geological observations.

A later and second period of eruption occurred about 50 years ago, but was of such a character as not to attract attention. The presence of hot springs in the Lassen district at Bumpass Hill near the south base of the peak, shows continued volcanic activity. The geologic district in which Mount Lassen is situated is 60 miles long and nearly 53 miles wide, comprising an area of 3,634 miles. Lassen peak is the south terminus of the Cascade range of mountains. The Lassen peak volcanic ridge is formed by a belt of volcanic cones 25 miles wide and 50 miles long. Lassen peak connects with Mount Shasta by lava deposits.

Palermo, Sicily, June 1.—A strike at the sulphur mines reached a climax today when a mob at Porto Empedocle destroyed half of the town. The rioters set fire to the sulphur stores, destroyed the shops, tore up railway tracks and cut the telephone and telegraph wires. Troops and police were dispatched to re-establish order.
