## MEN WASHED OVERBOARD

Two Members of Vanitie's Crew Fall Into Drink and Yacht Has to Stop to Save Them, Letting Herreshoff Boat Cross Line Easy Winner.

Rye, N. Y., June 4.—The third race of the initial series for the America's cup defense candidate yachts was won off here on Long Island sound today by the flag officer's sloop, Resolute after the Vanitie, withdrew while in the lead to assist in the rescue of two of her seamen who had been washed overboard. It was a disappointing ending of what had promised to be the best contest to date between the two 75-footers.
