CLIP CHUNKS OFF GRAIN  
REPORT THAT KAISER WOULD END WAR SENDS WHEAT ONTO TOBOGGAN  
Chicago, Sept. 17.—Wheat prices had a serious tumble today because it was not officially settled until after trading hours that Germany's answer to Pres- ident Wilson's offer of mediation was non-committal. There was a nervous feeling at the close, with prices 1 1/2 to 2c under last night. Corn suffered a net loss of 1 3/4 to 1 1/2c and oats, 1c to 1 1/2c. Provisions finished unchanged to 2 1/2c down.
