(Copied from an editorial published in the Missoula Free Press, Saturday, October 31.)

Two years ago Andrew J. Brower was a candidate for the Legislature. In his campaign he told the people of this county that if elected he would honestly and conscientiously strive to represent the people to the best of his ability.

We have found it a good rule to judge men by their past performances. It is reasonable to suppose that if elected to the senate he will continue along the same line as pursued by him in the lower house, except that his experience in the last session will give him more power in urging legislation.

In determining whether or not he should be sent to the senate a close scrutiny should be made of his department during the legislative session of 1913.

We have made such a search and we find that Mr. Brower's record is one of earnest effort in behalf of decent government and fairness to his constituents. We find that on no great public measure was he absent or did he refuse to be counted.

He favored and voted for the bill authorizing cities to own public utilities and the bill making the railroad commission ex officio the public service commission. He voted for the workman's compensation bill, the bill limiting the hours of female employment, commonly known as the eight hour law, the bill establishing a department of labor and the bill regulating the insurance business.

Mr. Brower introduced the farm loan bill in the house. This bill passed the house, as an amendment to Senate Bill No. 72, but failed of concurrence in the senate.

We consider this a record of which Mr. Brower and the people of Missoula county may well be proud. If he is elected to the senate and continues to render service of this character he will prove to be one of the most valuable men in the senate.
