THEATRICAL PROFESSION IN ENGLAND IS HARD HIT

London, Nov. 7.—Many cases of dire poverty are being reported to relief committees from among the class that depend upon furnishing amusements for their livelihoods. Small salaries actors, stage hands and others are threatened with starvation. The war

has hit the theaters and theater folk of the United Kingdom a hard blow. Whereas in ordinary times there are 400 traveling companies on the road, there are today less than half that number. The darkened streets in London have already resulted in a decision by many managers to give matinees daily and night performances twice weekly, thus reversing the established order of things; and many theaters have been closed. To the high salaried actor or actress who has saved up for a rainy day the situation is not so serious, but the theater employe needs substantial aid at once. Several relief movements have been started for their benefit.

Milwaukee, Nov. 7.—On the face of almost complete returns Paul O. Hustling, democrat, leads Governor F. E. McGovern, republican, for United States senator, by 1,378.

Port au Prince, Haiti, Nov. 7.—Davi-ilmir Theodore, leader of the recent successful revolution against the administration of President Zamor, was elected today president of the Haitian republic. The city was calm.

YSER TO MOSELLE IS SCENE OF BATTLE

ACTIVITY THERE MAY BE TO COVER WITHDRAWAL OF GERMANS

Paris, Nov. 8.—The Germans are showing renewed activity from the Yser to the Moselle, indicating, it is believed here, either their intention to begin another great effort for victory, or to conceal the withdrawal of troops to be sent to the eastern theater of war, or perhaps both. The battle around Ypres continues with undiminished fury, but as the allies continue to take the initiative, the advantage rests with them.

North of Ypres, that is, between it and Dixmude, neither side appears to be making any great efforts and no decisive result has been achieved. It is in the direction of Ronlers and the Lys that the enemy is now operating with all the forces at his disposal, with the object of driving the allies back on Boulogne. The allies now hold the advantage on their center and right wing. In this direction the enemy's extreme positions are at Wytschaete and Messines, facing west. Running from Kemmel toward the Lys, the hills rise to a height of 400 feet above sea level and dominating positions near Kemmel are in the hands of the allies. The valley of the Lys, through which the Germans are advancing, is only 50 feet above sea level, so that the allies have the benefit of stronger ground.

The struggle in the valley of the Scarpe continues with unabated intensity. The Germans still are making desperate efforts against Arras and at times shells have fallen into the city at the rate of 82 to the minute. But the French lines are established skillfully, making such use of the hills on the west and the small rivers Crinchon and Scarpe, which flow nearby, that the Germans, despite repeated attacks, have failed to make any impression on them. French artillery from well chosen positions sweep the plain over which the Germans are obliged to advance, inflicting severe punishment.

Investment of Verdun.
The latest German operations in the Argonne forest and on the plains of the Woivre district are part of a scheme to invest Verdun. This struggle to isolate the great fortress of the Meuse extends over a vast region. The actions on the heights east of the river and around St. Mihiel are a part of this campaign.

The French, however, are fully alive to the importance of the situation there and are taking the offensive with success at several points.

SUFFRAGE IS LAW COMPENSATION BEATEN

to determine whether Dan Boyle or J. E. McCormick was elected railroad commissioner. Additional returns were received today but the republicans and the democrats each still claim the victory.

Mr. Rankin, who bases his suffrage figures on reports received directly from the several counties, states:

For Suffrage.

"The following counties show, with incomplete returns, the following:

"For woman's suffrage—Jefferson, 50; Missoula, 1,100; Mineral, 128; Lincoln, 195; Ravalli, 800; Yellowstone, 358; Custer, 300; Big Horn, 78; Meagher, 48; Stillwater, 200; Fergus, 224; Rosebud, 50; Dawson, 100; Sheridan, 24 (from Culbertson alone); Broadwater, 28 (official); Carbon, 219 (official); Musselshell, 59 (official); Sanders, 300; Silver Bow, 23; Gallatin, 200; Park, 20. Total for, 4,558.

"The following counties appear to be against by the following vote with the returns nearly complete:

"Beaverhead, 24; Madison, 5; Hill, 24; Chouteau, 40; Cascade, 123; Deer Lodge, 501 (official); Lewis and Clark, 300; Powell, 75; Granite, 19; Blaine, 28.

"Total against, 1,156.

"Making total for suffrage, 3,402.

"The following counties not heard from definitely indicate the following:

"In Teton county, the town of Choteau went 2 to 1; Valler carried for suffrage by 20 votes; Conrad by 4 votes, indicating that suffrage will carry in Teton county by a good majority.

"Suffrage is carrying in Flathead county by 2 to 1, but no definite returns.

"Richland, Fallon and Valley are carrying for suffrage, but definite figures not available.

"Wibaux, small county, nothing heard from.

"Suffrage has carried the state of Montana by 3,400 votes already, and the final count will show a majority for suffrage of not less than 4,500 votes and perhaps upwards of 5,000."

"The majority against the compensation bill is 1,171 now," said P. B. Shelton, secretary of the advancement association, today. "This represents about 39,000 votes and includes complete returns from seven counties and 360 precincts in the remaining 22 counties."



PRICE OF FOOD FIXED IN HUNGARY BY STATUTE

Venice, Italy, via Paris, Nov. 7.—It is learned here that the Hungarian government is taking decisive steps to hold food prices on a reasonable level. Land owners and dealers in grain have been ordered to furnish complete reports of their stocks on hand, and already it has been found that there are much greater supplies of grain in the country than had been supposed.

When the returns are all in the government will fix a scale of maximum prices varying according to locality to offset any attempts to withhold stocks. Local authorities will be empowered to requisition supplies of all kinds of foodstuffs.
