Because it costs much money to send freight trains through the Bitter Root mountains, the Northern Pacific Railway company will send it all through the road from Whitehall to the Salmon river country and over the newly acquired Gilmore & Pittsburg road, to the coast, is the news which reached Missoula yesterday from Butte.

MONTANA MUNICIPAL LEAGUE ORGANIZED


