WALSH INTERCEDES FOR DUMB ANIMALS
Washington, Dec. 3.-Approval has been given by President Wilson to the movement to have the Geneva convention, under which Red Cross societies operate, extended so as to provide for attention to horses in war. Word of the president's action was cabled to the Purple-Cross service, a new organization which has been formed in the European war zone to care for horses on the battlefield.

Senator Walsh of Montana and Rev. Ernest Smith of this city, brought the movement to Mr. Wilson's attention. They told him injured horses were allowed to lie on the battlefields without care and that there was great need for veterinary ambulance corps to treat those slightly hurt and end the sufferings of animals beyond medical aid.

The proposed extension of the convention will be discussed at a meeting to be held in Geneva this month.

SINN FEIN TAKES NO MORE CHANCES
Dublin, Dec. 3.-The newspaper Sinn Fein did not appear today. Its publishers refusing to print it, in consequence of having been warned by the authorities that they would be liable to prosecution for the publication of treasonable matter. This is the second step in the suppression of Irish publications, which have been opposing German sentiment. The police last night raided the office of the Irish Freedom and confiscated all copies of the paper offered for sale.
