Hamilton, Dec. 27.—(Special)—Considerable interest has been aroused in the free concert to be given at the Lucas opera house Tuesday evening by the Hamilton orchestra, the Kregel quartet, the Hamilton Music club chorus and several well-known soloists, both vocal and instrumental. **WHITE SLAVER SENT TO PRISON FOR TWO YEARS**  
**FOR MRS. COLE THIS DAY**

MOTHER OF PROMINENT HAMILTON ATTORNEY TO BE LAID IN FINAL RESTING PLACE

Hamilton, Dec. 27.—(Special)—Funeral services over the body of Mrs. Cole, who died Wednesday afternoon at the home of her son, H. B. Cole, will be held tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Episcopal church. The services will be conducted by Rev. J. W. Heyward. The body will be interred in Riverview cemetery.

Mrs. Cole was born May 3, 1848, in Buffalo county, New York, and was 66 years of age at the time of her death. She came to Hamilton from Minneapolis about two years ago, having been an invalid since her husband's death, several years ago. She is survived by one son, Attorney Halbert B. Cole, of this city, and several brothers in Wisconsin.

**GEORGE HARVEY, CONVICTED IN HAMILTON UNDER DONLAN LAW AND SENTENCED**

TO PRISON FOR TWO YEARS

Hamilton, Dec. 27.—(Special)—George Harvey, who was found guilty of a violation of the Donlan white-slavery law by a jury in the district court recently, received his sentence before Judge R. Lee McCulloch yesterday. The court verified the punishment fixed by the jury—two years in the state penitentiary. Harvey was taken to Deer Lodge on the afternoon train yesterday by Deputy Sheriff Roy Myers of Corvallis.

As will be remembered, Harvey was arrested under orders of the court immediately after a hearing, which resulted in the sending of a 15-year-old girl of this city to the reform school. Harvey was charged with taking the girl to a house of ill fame. The jury had the case under discussion in the jury room for 24 hours.
