MISSOULA MEN WEAR KHAKI GARB AT LAST

Camp Lewis Contingent Gets Full Equipment After Long Wait.

REAL SOLDIERS NOW

Fellows Swagger on Street Like "Long Service" Veterans.

Camp Lewis, American Lake, Wash. (Correspondence.)—The uniforms have arrived, and commotion reigns in camp today. The men were unexpectedly ordered to line up for inspection, and then the surprise was sprung; the rookies were given khaki suits, hats, underwear, socks, leggings and everything that is necessary for the jaunty appearance of the soldier.

New Men Arriving. Drafted contingents from various parts of the state are arriving every day; 100 men from eastern Montana came in today, and were stationed with the Missoula detachment, which swells their numbers to about 250 men.

The arrival of the third contingent is going to set the soldiers here back somewhat in their drill maneuvers. The tricks of the soldier game are fast being mastered by the men, but a delay will be necessary while waiting for the green ones to become seasoned.

Missoula Men Doing Well. The Missoula boys are running strong for the non-commissioned job. Lennon has been appointed first sergeant and has full command of the barracks in the absence of the officers. He is well liked by every soldier in the company.

Welvoda, a young fellow who ran a store in Arlee, and previously lived in Missoula, has been given a temporary mess sergeant's job. Lanning is doing temporary stenographic work and is now a sergeant, and Otto Beller, one time of the Florence hotel, is now the head cook. Phil Hull is acting corporal and is in line for a sergeant's bars.

Out of 11 appointments to "non-com" positions, nine were given to Missoula men.

Camp Grows Rapidly. The buildings springing up overnight at Camp Lewis; there are several thousand carpenters at work here and it is wonderful the way the houses are built—one night a foundation is

noticed, and the next morning there is a building there. The new Y. M. C. A. building was built last week, and is directly across from the Missoula company's barracks. It will be open for amusement sometime this week.

SULLIVAN ON STAND CREATES SENSATION

Go-Between in Philadelphia Election Row Testifies.

Philadelphia, Oct. 9.—Sudden production on the witness stand of Michael J. Sullivan, alleged "go-between" in the Fifth ward primary election row, which resulted in the killing of a policeman, created a mild sensation when the hearing of Mayor Thomas H. Smith and eight others on charges of conspiracy to murder was resumed before Judge Brown today in the municipal court.

Sullivan, who admitted that he had brought 18 gunmen here from New York for election work, was arrested by detectives from the district attorney's office. His testimony corroborated that last week of Samuel G. Maloney, manager of the local branch of the Val O'Farrell detective agency, by whom he was employed as an operative.

Sullivan said Maloney gave him \$100 after the row and told him to "lay low." He fled to a lumber camp on an island in the Delaware river at the Delaware water gap and remained there until he was arrested yesterday.

FORESTRY OFFICERS DRUM UP RECRUITS

Men Sought for Engineering Regiment.

Huge posters bearing the picture of a soldier with an axe and a written appeal for loggers to join the forces of Uncle Sam were sent out yesterday to all the forest supervisors to be distributed in the lumber camps in their respective districts.

This is the first campaign that has been fired in the big campaign which is being conducted by the district office to get recruits for the forestry regiment which will soon see service in the forests of France.

A special demand has been made for men experienced to some degree in logging. The particular lines of work designated include sawyers, sawmill engineers, filers, millwrights, edgers, firemen, woods-bosses and transportation men.

C. E. Knopf, district lumberman, left yesterday for Spokane, where he will open a recruiting office from which to send out officials and circular letters to get the loggers to enlist in the new regiment.

PERSHING IS MADE GENERAL IN ARMY

American Leaders Receive Commissions.

Washington, Oct. 8.—President Wilson today signed commissions as generals for Major General Tasker H. Bliss, army chief of staff, and Major General John J. Pershing, commanding the American forces in Europe. Though both officers have equal rank, general Bliss takes precedence by virtue of his position as the directing head of the entire army organization.

The grade of lieutenant general also was revived by congress, the rank to be given commanders of army corps, but it was stated authoritatively at the war department today that there is no intention of creating any lieutenant generals or army corps in the United States at this time, as the divisional training system will be continued. An army corps under the new army organization, based on developments of trench warfare, is composed of three or more divisions.


