

PAUL SIMPSON GIVEN HONORS

Stevensville Boy Is Taken Into Honor Fraternity at Washington.

PRESIDENT OF SOCIETY

Students' Branch of Large National Organization Elects Him.

Of three men pledged at the University of Washington last week, to the honorary chemistry fraternity, Phi Lambda Upsilon, one is Paul Simpson, who took his freshman year of study at the University of Montana. Their initiation will be held within the next two weeks.

Another honor which has come to Mr. Simpson within the last few days, is his election as president of the University of Washington students' branch of the American Chemical Society. This is the nation's largest chemical society, with a membership of 15,000. Its work as a national organization is the publication of the Journal of Industrial Engineering Chemistry; the Journal of the American Chemical Society and the Abstract Journal, which is the biggest magazine of its kind in the world and which is published twice a month. The society has also published an index which covers every article that has been published concerning chemistry in the last ten years.

BOY SCOUTS PLAN THRIFT CAMPAIGN

Youngsters Will Help Uncle Sam by Selling Stamps.

The Boy Scouts of Missoula, beginning this week, will conduct a campaign to be known as the "Red Postcard Campaign" for Thrift stamps. The government has printed 5,000,000 of these cards and they are being distributed throughout the nation.

The scouts take orders for the delivery, by the postmaster, of the amount of Thrift stamps specified by the purchaser. The cards are mailed to the postoffice and the stamps delivered.

There is keen competition in the "Red Postcard Campaign." The Boy Scout who gets 25 orders for Thrift stamps gets an Achievement button. If he signs the purchasers for \$10 worth of stamps each, making a total of \$250, the scout gets an "Ace" medal. As soon as any scout reaches the sum of \$250 he will get this ace medal, even though he must sign more than 25 purchasers to reach this amount.

The Missoula scouts are going into this campaign for all they are worth and will endeavor to co-operate with other Montana scouts in order to bring to Montana proper credit. They, too, the record troop in each state gets an American flag, properly inscribed. The boys want this for Missoula.

Flattering Offer Comes to University Chemist

An encouraging offer has come to Merle C. Gallagher, who will take his degree from the department of chemistry at the university, at the end of this quarter. The Barrett Chemical company of Philadelphia has sent for the young Montana chemist to come to that city for a conference, promising to pay his traveling expenses east and in case they do not come to an agreement, to pay his return expenses to Missoula.

Mr. Gallagher will step for a few days at Wabasha, Minn., with his parents, Rev. and Mrs. Elmer Gallagher, who were residents of Missoula while Mr. Gallagher was pastor of the Congregational church in this city.


