MINING AND STOCK NEWS.

Items of Interest Concerning Montana's two Great Industries.

The Development of Montana Mines.—Stock Notes Carefully Gathered From Carefully Gathered.

The Paradise mine in Humboldt county will have its electric plant ready for use by the 1st proximo.

The total bullion yield of the mines on the Comstock lode, for the quarter ending June 30, 1887, was \$1,072,902.80.

August Bina was last Friday crushed by a falling rock in his mine above Meadorville from the effects of which he died Sunday morning.

The Jay Gould product for the month of November footed up \$37,000, \$4,000 of which was in concentrates, and the remainder in bullion.

Work on construction of the new ore chutes of the Montana Consolidated is being pushed vigorously, and they will soon be ready for business.

The report of the citizens' committee on the new gold field in Arizona is extremely favorable but by no means so highly colored as those first published.

The colony of Victoria offers rewards of from £200 to £1,000 for the discovery of new gold fields, and for the establishment of improved processes of reducing ores.

Articles of incorporation were filed yesterday in the office of the secretary of the territory for the Alpine Gold and Silver mining, concentrating and smelting company, which will operate in Jefferson county, the principal office being at Wickes. The capital stock is fixed at \$2,500,000, divided into 500,000 shares at \$5 each.

Articles of incorporation of the Constitution mining, milling and prospecting company have been filed. The capital stock is placed at \$1,500,000 in 300,000 shares of \$5 each. The object of the company is to prospect, develop and work quartz lode claims and to do a general mining and milling business throughout Silver Bow district.

Articles of incorporation have been filed for the Whippoorwill and Last Chance mining company, to do a general mining and milling business in the Bitter Root valley, the principal office of the company being at Stevensville. The capital stock is fixed at \$1,000,000, divided into 200,000 shares, par value, \$5 each. The incorporators and trustees are Geo. W. Wade, Wm. C. Bay, Fred Buck, Amos Brock and Henry Buck. The Whippoorwill mine adjoins the famous Curlew.

Madisonian: The New York and Montana mining company, through Mr. C. H. Ramsey, has renewed the lease of the Prospect mine, and will work it on an more extensive scale than hitherto. The consummation of this bargain ensures the running of the company's mill in Virginia City continuously. Had the company not scoured other ground to work on, the reduction works would be compelled to "hang up" occasionally; as, although the Alameda is looking and pining as well as ever, the ore product from it is not sufficiently large to keep them running.

The statistics of the office of the United States Collector of Customs give the transportation of silver ore from Mexico at El Paso, Tex., last month as 6,762 tons valued at \$340,135. This is an average of 225 tons per day and an average value of \$51 per ton. The daily average for October was 17 tons, and the highest daily average for any month preceding October was 147 tons for last January. The total importation for the past eleven months is 40,496 tons against a total of 22,945 tons for 1883 and 853 tons for 1885. The value of importations for the past five months is \$2,661,245 against a total of \$1,545,777 for 1883 and \$792,275 for 1885.

W. J. Raymond, of Virginia City, has sent ten pairs to Kentucky to be bred to Red Wilkes and Wilton, the worthy sons of the greatly distinguished sire, George Wilkes.

Great Falls Tribune: The quartermaster general recently advertised for "American goldings, Montana bred." This is the first time in an advertisement that the breed has been specified.

Leonard Johnson, of the Maple Point stock farm, Northfield, Minn., has just returned from France with over 70 head of choice Percheron stallions and mares, and a few extra coach stallions, making over 100 head.
