WASHINGTON, D. C., August 8, 1893.—Following is the full text of President Cleveland's message to the extra session, read before congress to-day.

PURCHASE AND COINAGE OF SILVER by the general government. This legislation is embodied in the statute passed the 14th of July, 1890, which was the culmination of much agitation on the subject involved and which may be considered a truce, after a long struggle, between the advocates of free silver coinage and those intending to be more conservative.

THE SILVERNATIONS Almost All the World Acknowledges the Metal. NATIONS THAT USE SILVER MONEY

THE DARK CONTINENT INTERESTING LETTER FROM AFRICAN GOLD FIELDS.
