REPUBLICAN COUNTY CONVENTION

By direction of the republican county convention held in the city of Glasgow, Montana, on September 15th, 1908, the Valley County Republican nominating convention is hereby called to meet at the Opera House hall in the city of Glasgow at the hour of 12 o'clock noon, on Monday the 29th day of September, 1908, for the purpose of nominating a full county ticket as follows:
One Representative in the Legislature.
One Treasurer.
One County Clerk and Recorder.
One Clerk of the District Court.
One Sheriff.
One County Attorney.
One Surveyor.
One Coroner.
One Public Administrator.
One Assessor.
One County Superintendent of Schools.
One County Commissioner, six year term.
Said convention is also empowered to nominate candidates for all township offices; to elect a county Central Committee and to transact any and all other business as may properly come before it. And to that end and for that purpose, precinct nominating conventions will be held at the usual places for holding such meetings in each of the following-named precincts, and the precinct committees of the various precincts are requested to see that the primaries are organized and held at the hour and designated in each of their respective precincts.
The support of each of the several precincts is based on one delegate and one alternate delegate for every twelve votes or fraction thereof at east for the republican representative in congress at the general election of 1908, and is as follows:

Each precinct is entitled to elect an alternate delegate a number corresponding with the number of delegates as apportioned.
The following rules will govern the deliberations of the Valley County Republican convention:
1. Delegates and alternate delegates shall be republican residents of the precinct which they represent.
2. In the absence of a delegate his alternate shall cast his vote.
3. In the absence of a delegate and his alternate, a majority of the delegation from that precinct shall cast the vote of the alternate.
4. In the absence of all the delegates and alternates from any precinct, no vote shall be cast from such precinct.

dates and Mr. Allen's nomination was made by acclamation. To a motion to suspend the roll call, B. F. White objected and the roll was called, to the end without bringing out any other candidates.
Mr. Allen spoke briefly on accepting the nomination and offered his services during the campaign to the central committee.
Judge Holloway by acclamation, Ed. Pease, of Gallatin, nominated Judge W. L. Holloway for associate justice of the supreme court.
"Judge Holloway might have for his motto, 'Well done, good and faithful servant,'" was Mr. Pease's closing remark. There was no other candidate, roll call was suspended and nomination was made by acclamation.
The democratic county convention was held in this city last Monday afternoon and was well attended by delegates from the various precincts of the county. J. L. Truscott was elected as chairman and F. W. Hall as secretary. The following were the nominees for the various offices:
Representative, S. P. Mitchell, Springdale; sheriff, S. C. Small Glasgow; clerk of court, I. A. Oakes, Culbertson; clerk and recorder, W. G. Schneider, Saco; treasurer, Lyman Barnes, Malta; county attorney, Thomas Dignan, Glasgow; assessor Septimus Drabbs, Hinsdale; coroner, R. P. Minick, Saco; county commissioner six-year term, L. P. Herring, Glasgow. Nobody wanted the nomination for county superintendent, nor the public administratorship, so it was left to the mercy of the central committee. For the Malta precinct B. W. Brockway was nominated for justice of the peace and Otto Cassidy for constable. After endorsing most everyone in the party the convention adjourned.
