ORDINANCE NO. 49.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CLOSING OF SALOONS AND OTHER PLACES WHERE INTOXICATING LIQUORS ARE SOLD OR DISPENSED AND THE CLOSING OF BOWLING ALLEYS, SHOOTING GALLERIES, AND BILLIARD AND POOL HALLS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MALTA:

SECTION 1. Hereafter no person, persons, corporation or association shall keep open any saloon, bar-room, club-bar, or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold or dispensed, within the city limits between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight of each Saturday night and six o'clock a.m. of the following Monday. No person except the owner or employees of any saloon, bar-room, club-bar, or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold or dispensed shall be permitted to remain in such saloon, bar-room, club-bar, or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold or dispensed between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight of each Saturday night and six o'clock a.m. of the following Monday.

SECTION 2. Hereafter no person, persons, corporation or association shall keep open any bowling alley, shooting gallery, billiard or pool hall within the city limits between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight of each Saturday night and six o'clock a.m. of the following Monday. No person except the owner or employees of any bowling alley, shooting gallery, billiard and pool hall shall be permitted to remain in such bowling alley, shoot-

ing gallery, billiard and pool hall between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight of each Saturday night and six o'clock a.m. of the following Monday morning.

SECTION 3. All windows, shades, blinds or screens in any saloon, bar-room, club-bar, or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold or dispensed, and bowling alleys, shooting galleries, billiard and pool halls, within the city limits shall be raised, opened or removed between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight of each Saturday night and six o'clock a.m. of the following Monday morning, so that an unobstructed view of the bar and interior of such saloon, club-bar, bar-room, or other place where intoxicating liquors are sold or dispensed, and bowling alleys, shooting galleries, billiard and pool halls, shall be had from the street or exterior of such place.

SECTION 4. Any person, persons, corporation or association violating any of the provisions of the three preceding sections shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty (\$50) dollars and not more than two hundred (\$200) dollars, or by imprisonment of not more than thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after thirty (30) days from the date of its passage and approval. Passed by the Town Council this 9th day of December, 1913.


