### Turkey Protests Against Sale to Greece.

### OTHER NATIONS ALERT

Representatives of European Powers Point Out That Proposed Action by United States Would Be Interference With Old World Affairs.

Washington, June 16.—The United States is in danger of becoming involved in a serious controversy with Turkey as a result of the proposal of Secretary Daniels to sell the battleships Idaho and Mississippi to Greece.

The Turkish ambassador, in accordance with the instruction of his government, has addressed inquiries on the subject to Secretary Bryan and has made it clear that these vessels will be used against his country if transferred to the Grecian flag.

Inquiries also have been made by certain European nations which believe that if the Greek navy should not be increased peace will be preserved.

European diplomats make no secret of the view they entertain that the United States, by aiding Greece so materially, will be intervening in the politics of the Old World. They feel their governments would be justified in interfering in American questions.

### MORE VICTIMS OF GUNMEN

One Dead and Three Wounded in New York City.

New York, June 16.—William Pellegrini, in Bellevue hospital, refused to divulge the names of his assailants or to tell how his brother Salvatore was murdered in front of the Church of the Immaculate Conception.

The brothers were decoyed from their home by two men on the invitation to go to a saloon. As they passed the church the two decoys fell back. Salvatore received a bullet in his back.

William was struck in the back twice and in the neck once. Before the police arrived the gunmen had vanished.

Two children were shot in the legs during the fray. It is believed the crime was in revenge for the brothers' capture of two burglars recently.

### INSURGENT ATTACK ON CAPITAL REPULSED

Prince William Personally Leads Albanian Forces.

Durazzo, Albania, June 16.—The government troops under the personal leadership of Prince William repulsed a strong attack on the Albanian capital by Musselman insurgents.

At the outset of the fighting the insurgents gained an advantageous position. After Colonel Thomson, the Dutch commander of the gendarmerie, had been killed, Prince William placed himself at the head of the defenders and quieted the rifle and artillery fire of the attacking force after three hours' fighting.

The attack by the insurgents came as a complete surprise to the residents of the capital, where official statements had been published declaring that the Musselman rebels against the rule of Prince William had been utterly defeated by the government forces a few days ago. It was asserted that the remnant of the rebel forces was surrounded by government troops at Shkai, between Durazzo and Tirana.

Naval Officer is Rewarded for Service at Vera Cruz.



### TO COMMAND ATLANTIC FLEET

Rear Admiral Fletcher's Work at Vera Cruz Commended.

Washington, June 16.—Officers and bluejackets of the United States navy who distinguished themselves at the occupation of Vera Cruz have been commended and rewarded by the navy department.

Rear Admiral Frank F. Fletcher will be given command of the great Atlantic fleet at the expiration of Rear Admiral Badger's term. The department commends Fletcher as "not only a great admiral, but a statesman and diplomat as well."
