Exposition Commission Plans for Motion Pictures.

Many of the commercial clubs and business enterprises throughout the state are planning to take advantage of the opportunity for valuable advertising which is being offered by the Montana Exposition Commission, in the plan for taking motion pictures over the state, of the different resources and points of interest of Montana.

The scheme as outlined by the commission allows any particular interest, association, or individual to subscribe for a section of film sufficient to display the desired industry, at a very nominal cost. It is planned to run these pictures each day at the exposition, and also to display them at different picture houses about the state before the opening of the exposition. The value of such advertising can be readily seen, and it seems particularly fitting that pictures taken during this year—Montana's Golden Anniversary—should be displayed at the gathering of the nations in 1915. It is Montana's opportunity to show

the world the progress she has made during the half century of her existence as a territory and state.

It is reported that parties are endeavoring to secure contracts for motion pictures in some parts of the state, giving the impression that the pictures are to be used in connection with the Montana exhibit. The Commission has no such agents in the field, and parties desiring to contract for pictures should communicate with Frank Hazelbaker, secretary of the commission, at Dillon.
