

## NEWS IN MONTANA

### Events Happening in Various Parts of the State.

### TENSE SITUATION AT BUTTE

**Factional Troubles Among Union Miners Cause Officials and Citizens Much Uneasiness.**

Ever since the labor riots of two weeks ago, caused by factional fights in the local union of the Western Federation of Miners, Butte has labored under a tense situation. The new independent union of miners, which was formed in opposition to the Western Federation of Miners, reported it had signed up 2,288 members out of the 9,000 metal miners. The inquest into the death of Ernest J. Noy, who was killed during the rioting June 23, was continued until July 6 after the testimony of numerous witnesses was taken. Testimony was to the effect that the first shot was fired from miners' hall and that the bullets that killed Noy came from the hall. Edward Duncan, son of the mayor, testified that while he was in the hall he saw that President Moyer was armed, as were almost all the other men in the room.

### MORE VIOLENCE AT BUTTE

**Miners' Union Factions and Deputy Sheriffs Clash.**

Violence broke out anew in the struggle between factions of the Butte miners' union and two men were shot, one of them being killed, by the fusillade fired by deputy sheriffs in clearing Union hall. Charles H. Moyer, president of the Western Federation of Miners, and other officers of the union fled through the rear door when the shooting began. Many armed deputies were at the hall to preserve order at a meeting called to outline plans for settling the differences between the factions of the local union. Many of the seceders, who have planned to organize a new union under the auspices of the Industrial Workers of the World, were around the miners' headquarters. Governor Stewart offered state aid in bringing about peace in a telegram to President McDonald of the new miners' union. The offer was declined.

### AUTOMOBILE TURNS OVER

**One Man Killed and Several Others Injured.**

Robert W. Lowery of Great Falls, president of the Lindsay Wholesale Fruit and Produce company, was killed instantly; William Roberts, a contractor, was fatally injured; R. A. Gamble, president of the Gamble-Robinson Commission company of Minneapolis, was slightly injured and A. L. Smith, local manager for the Gamble interests, severely bruised in an automobile accident on the boulevard at Great Falls when their car turned over. The three guests of Mr. Lowery landed clear of the machine, but he was caught by the steering gear and his skull was crushed. Mr. Gamble was severely bruised about the face and his right breast was contused.


