### GREAT FALLS MAY GET BEET SUGAR PLANT

Whether Great Falls will in the future have added to her industries a beet sugar factory, for which the officers and directors of the Great Falls Commercial Club have earnestly worked for a period of years, will depend materially upon the outcome of a visit to that city of Henry H. Rolopp of Ogden, Utah, president of the Amalgamated Sugar company and also president of the United States Sugar Manufacturers' Association.

In his letters to the club Mr. Rolopp has given it to understand that in order to insure a sufficient amount of raw material for the operation of such a plant it would be necessary to have under contract from 5,000 to 6,000 acres of land for a period of five years.

To this the club officers replied that it was believed such an acreage could be secured, citing the fact that in recent months Kurt Grunwald, who was understood to be representing some beet sugar interests, had secured contracts covering about 7,000 acres. It was also stated that during the present season the commercial club had put out among the farmers 700 pounds of sugar beet seed for experimental purposes and this was believed would result in creating interest in that class of produce among the soil tillers who would necessarily be required to contribute to the supplying of beets for a factory.

Mr. Rolopp is not alone interested in the Great Falls district, but he has also been in correspondence with commercial organizations in Conrad, Harlem, Malta, Glasgow and other Montana points and it is probable that he may investigate some of these other fields before leaving the state.


