## NOVEMBER TERM DISTRICT COURT.

November 1st at 10 o'clock a. m., the first regular term of the district court for Phillips county will convene in the court house rooms in Malta and a large venire of jurors have been called to report at different times during the session. There are several important cases to be tried including one murder case. The cases in the order in which they appear on the calendar are as follows:

**Criminal Cases.**  
No. 27. State of Montana vs. Rober Lilly, murder. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and Tressler & Kirton for defendant. This is a case from Zortman in which the defendant is alleged to have killed a man named Hamilton.

No. 31. State of Montana vs. Peter Miller. Statutory charge. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., attorney for the state and Tressler & Kirton for the defendant.

No. 34. The state of Montana vs. Phillip Copp. Statutory charge. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and Tressler & Kirton for defendant.

No. 23. State of Montana vs. Alfred Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens and Dignan & Borton for the defendant. Defendant is alleged to have stolen some horses out in the Larb hills.

No. 6. State of Montana vs. William Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for the defendant. Doney is alleged to be guilty of rustling cattle. Another one of the Larb hills cases.

No. 16. The state of Montana vs. John Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for defendant. Cattle rustling case from Larb hills.

No. 17. State of Montana vs. Henry Moran. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for the defendant. Defendant accused of rustling cattle.

No. 11. State of Montana vs. John H. Hutton. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and Norris, Hurd & McKellar for defendant. Hutton is alleged to have stolen a horse down near Saco.

No. 7. State of Montana vs. Edward Armstrong. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens and Norris, Hurd & McKellar for defendant. Another one of the cattle rustling cases from the Larb hills.

No. 11. State of Montana vs. Roy Nelson. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and Tressler & Kirton for defendant. Nelson is alleged to have stolen horses near Saco.

No. 12. The state of Montana vs. W. H. Spencer. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and W. O. McConnell for defendant. One of the Larb hills cattle cases.

No. 3. State of Montana vs. Joe Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for defendant. Cattle rustling case.

No. 10. State of Montana vs. Lally Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for defendant. This is one of the cattle cases from the Larb hills.

No. 15. State of Montana vs. Alfred Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for defendant. One of the cattle rustling cases.

No. 4. State of Montana vs. Alfred Doney. Grand larceny. Same attorney and similar case to No. 15.

No. 1. State of Montana vs. Lewis Verbeck. Grand larceny. Maiming and killing of animals. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and R. P. Sandlie for defendant. This was the first criminal case filed in the new county of Phillips and was transferred here from old Valley county.

No. 20. State of Montana vs. Walter Sizer. Assault. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for state. Sizer is accused of making a gun play out at Zortman.

No. 37. State of Montana vs. J. A. Crowder. Petit larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for state and J. W. Callicotte for defendant. This is a dispute over cutting of some hay and was appealed from the justice court.

No. 38. State of Montana vs. Avery F. Stratton. Misdemeanor. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for state and J. W. Callicotte for defendant. This case was appealed from the lower court and is to settle a fencing matter down in the Sun Prairie country.

No. 9. The state of Montana vs. Alexander Doney. Grand larceny. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., for the state and C. H. Stevens for defendant. The last of the Larb hills horse stealing cases.

New cases filed since the calendar was printed are the state of Montana vs. T. R. Schoenborn on a statutory charge, with H. L. Wolfe, Jr., representing the county and R. E. O'Keefe the defendant, and the case of the state of Montana vs. John L. Stanton, charged with assault in the second degree. H. L. Wolfe, Jr., to appear for the state and J. W. Callicotte for the defendant.
