Rather than be liable to another three years term of enlistment, practically every member of Company B, national guard of Montana will refuse to take the new federal oath. In fact, the guardsmen must serve with their present terms of enlistment expire, but if they take the federal oath, they will then be placed on the reserve list for an additional three years, in respect that is not pleasing after the experience last summer on the border.

The legislature will be asked to establish a sub-experiment station in eastern Montana beyond the winter wheat belt, and another station of the flathead reservation, according to Prof. F. B. Linsford and F. S. Coley of the agriculture college. These additional stations, with those already established, at Bozeman, Moscow and Havre, will cover all farming and livestock problems owing to climatic conditions and altitude.

Representatives of 70 rod and gun clubs of the state are to meet at Lewistown, to originate a proposed enlightening the public of Montana as to be the benefits of game and fish conservation and to discuss proposed legislation affecting the preservation of angling and hunting through the medium of a state organization. The plan of the state convention was proposed at a meeting of the Butte Angler's club. It is said there are from 5,000 to 7,000 members of rod and gun clubs in Montana.
